For a few days you can play PlayStation 4 games directly on your Android device (smartphone or tablet). Even more fun is playing on your phone with the appropriate DualShock 4 controller. Yes, it is very easy to connect to a smartphone or tablet via Bluetooth. How does it work? I'll show you this on the following lines. Before we deal with pairing the controller, but first a few points need to be considered. Sticky: To even use the Remote Play feature on your Android device, you must download and install a system software update for the PlayStation 4 (Pro) version of 7.00. Did you do that? Well, then it goes on. You can download the PS4 Remote Play app for free from the Google Play Store. To do this, however, you must have at least Android 5 Lollipop installed on the right device. If this is not the case, you will not be able to download the app from the Play Store, and it is time you buy a new device. Warning: The prerequisite for using the DS4 controller is Android 10. In addition, you need to make sure that your Android device is on the same Wi-Fi network as the PS4 console. The PlayStation 4 console must also be connected to the router (modem) using a LAN cable. Unfortunately, wifi is not possible. Can you check all the points? Well, then it's time to pair up with an Android device. PS4 DualShock 4 controller to connect to your Android smartphone - so you'll follow a step-by-step guide on how to connect the DS4 Controller to your Android phone or of course your tablet. Activate Bluetooth on your smartphone or tablet. Now go to Bluetooth in the system settings under the connections (or similar). There's a controller now appearing as a PS4 DualShock Controller. Source: Android Central Best answer: Yes, as long as Android devices are updated to Android 10 and iOS devices are updated to iOS 13, DualShock 4 controllers will be supported via Bluetooth. The PC also supports DualShock controllers with a wired connection. Connect it: DualShock 4 (black) (47 on Amazon) In order to use DualShock 4 on PC, you need via USB. It won't work with PS4 Remote Play wirelessly on your computer via Bluetooth connection. This may not be the case in the future if Sony finally lets you maintain it wirelessly, but you're stuck with a USB connection until it happens. Macs received support for DualShock 4 controllers via Bluetooth back in October 2019 with a macOS Catalina update. Is DualShock 4 compatible with PS4 Remote Play on any mobile device? Yes. As long as you run Android 10 or iOS 13 (or later), DualShock 4 controllers will be compatible via Bluetooth. Previously, it was only compatible with Sony Xperia phones, and since checking sales numbers of about two people in the world owned one, it was virtually useless before. What are the workarounds to use it on iOS without the latest update? If you don't have iOS13, you'll need to use a workaround to get the DualShock controller running. It should be noted that this only works if you are close enough to the PS4 that DualShock can connect to it. Sign in to your secondary account on PS4. Connect your secondary account to a remote PS4 game. Once the controller automatically shuts down, turn it on by clicking the PS button and log into your main account through the Remote Play screen. At this point it should allow you to use the controller because the PS4 Remote Play is still streaming out of your secondary account. PS4 Remote Play is best suited on Android 10 (Image: SONY) PS4 Remote Game is now available on a number of different devices, thanks to the recent 7.00 update. But only Android users who have the latest build is set to be able to play games with all the controller functions. The new patch is relatively small to download and will take about 500MB on your chosen PlayStation console. And with it comes the PS4 Remote Play Access for Android devices via 5.0 and updates. The good news is that it's pretty straightforward to customize it on your phone, the downside being that not everyone can connect them to a DualShock PS4 controller. HOW USE REMOTE PLAY WITH PS4 CONTROLLER For those who don't know, Remote Play is a system released by Sony a few years ago that has been limited to Sony Mobile Devices. That changed today with the launch of 7.00 update and means that most modern Android devices now have access. It reflects your PlayStation 4 screen on your phone and provides delivers controller to use. The only problem is that many gamers hate the touch screen and would prefer DualShock. The best way to get started is to make sure that you have a DualShock controller paired with your chosen device. CONNECTING PS4 CONTROLLER Before start, there was some confusion over what controllers could be used with the PS4 Remote Play App. Sony has confirmed that DualShock 4 Controllers can be used wirelessly with remote playback, but only if you have Android 10 installed. Some users have reported being able to use wired controllers, but there seems to be a lot of problems going down this route. For Android 10 mobile devices, you can now connect the

DUALSHOCK wireless controller®4 via Bluetooth for remote playback, Sony explains. Download the latest version of the PS4 Second Screen, available from Google Play™ or App Store. If you have Android 10 installed, the next step is to pair the PS4 controller for your Android phone using Bluetooth radio. PS4 Remote Play is available through the 7.00 update (Image: SONY) This should be an option on the top menu of Android options, and you can reach the full menu of Connected Devices by holding on to the Bluetooth button. When your Bluetooth is on, you can grab your PS4 controller and start the pairing process. This will include pressing the PlayStation button and the Share button at the same time until the light bar starts flashing. When this starts, just go to the connected device menu on your phone and select the wireless controller option. The lightbar should then stop blinking and stabilize, indicating a successful pairing. Once you've done that, the next stage of the Remote Play setting can begin. REMOTE PLAY ON ANDROIDHead to Google PlayStore and download the official PS4 Remote Play App.It a tiny installation size and should take just a few minutes to get added to your phone/device. Unfortunately, Remote Play on PS4 only supports WiFi connections at this time. Once you open the Remote Play app, you'll need to make sure your phone and PS4 have the same internet connection. You can then press the Start button and get to the PSN login page, which means you'll need to have your sign in the details in hand. The Remote Play app should then get a connection and you'll have access to the PS4 mirror screen. Recall that if you don't have Android 10 installed on your device, you won't be able to use the Dualshock controller through Bluetooth settings. There are also reports that while older versions of the DS4 can handle a wired connection with remote playback, the new version is not compatible. To get the DS4 running through OTG on playback on Android first launches the app and games, and only then connect the pad via the OTG cable. I just checked this out on the Galaxy Tab S4 (Android 9) playing Borderlands 3 and it works almost like Almost because the touchpad doesn't work, but you can still use it by tapping the screen yourself.
