The hospital is a member of Saint Peter's Healthcare System, Inc. a New Jersey non-profit corporation sponsored by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Metuchen. Review Saint Peter's University Hospital is a non-profit, 478-licensed bed acute care training hospital. St. Peter's Condition has been designated as the Specialty Acute Care Children's Hospital, regional perinatal center and stroke center[1][2], which manages one of the largest maternity services in New Jersey and the country. The hospital is the principal clinical affiliate of Rutgers Biomedical and Health Sciences.[3] provides full-time training to up to 60 students in the third or fourth years of medical school and has a clinical connection to the Philadelphia Children's Hospital. [4] The woman and children's pavilion at Saint Peters University Hospital's History at Saint Peter's University Hospital was opened in 1907 as a 25-bed hospital in Somerset and Hardenburgh streets of New Brunswick. Saint Peter's moved to its current location at 254 Easton Avenue in New Brunswick in 1929 as a 125-bed facility. In 1959, a three-over 349-bed addition was built. In 1976, a five-storey tower was completed, with an emergency department, radiology department, surgery and recovery kit, as well as a 40-bed care unit. In 1991, a pavilion for women and children was added. In 1999, the Outpatient Resource Centre (CARES) building was built. In 2008, new telemetry, maternity and oncology departments were completed. [5] At the end of 2019, it was announced that rwjbarnabas health executives and the heads of St. Peter's health care system signed a letter of intent to investigate the merger. [6] [7] [8] The Preliminary Plan calls for significant investments by RWJBarnabas Health to help expand the outpatient services currently provided by St. Peter's. [9] [10] St. Peter's Church will remain a Catholic hospital and continue to be sponsored by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Metuchen. [11] [12] [13] both sides have been in discussions for some time and believe that both sides could benefit from the merger. [14] [15] The merger would also strengthen the educational services provided by two already affiliated Rutgers-related hospitals. [16] On 10 September 2020, it was announced that healthcare systems had signed a final agreement that the two systems would merge. [17] [18] The merger would create the largest academic medical centre in the country. After the agreement was signed, the potential partnership started a review period for state and federal regulatory agencies. The announcement comes less than a year after Peter and RWJBH signed a letter of intent to explore the strategic partnership. Today's announcement also focuses on a three-year understanding of St. Peter's Understanding, which in October 2018 included a proposal to look for a strategic partner that best suits to help the organization maintain its rich Catholic mission and identity in an ever-changing and competitive healthcare market. After careful consideration of Saint Peter's Board of Governors, Senior Management and Most Reverend James F. Checchio, Bishop of the Metuchen Diocese and the only corporate member of Saint Peter's, we are The final agreement to integrate with RWJBarnabas Health, which ensures Saint Peter's continued mission and identity as a Catholic hospital, said Leslie D., FA HirschCHE President and CEO of Peter Saint's Healthcare the terms of the final agreement, St. Peter's Hospital – with its flagship hospital, St. Peter's University Hospital, 478-bed acute care training hospital and acute care children's hospital – will remain a full-service acute health care provider serving New Jersey and the region, and will continue its long-term mission and identity as a Catholic hospital, respecting the standards of care formulated in the Catholic Health Services Ethics and Religious Directives (ERDs). In addition, RWJBH is committed to making significant strategic investments in equipment, technologies and innovations in order to improve and expand the clinical services provided by St. Peter. RWJBH has a rich history of providing high-quality care to new jersey residents – with our Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital camps in New Brunswick and Somerville, as well as our Rutgers partners at the Cancer Institute of New Jersey and Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, to name but some – and the inclusion of Saint Peter's will allow us to only build on this legacy of service, said Barry H.
