Challenge 1 You will be presented with a graph, table, chart or diagram and invited to describe, summarize or explain the information in their own words. You may be asked to describe and submit data, describe the stages of the process, how something works, or describe an object, plan, or design. Challenge 2 you will be asked to write an essay in response to a point of view, argument or problem. You will support your point of view with relevant examples from your own knowledge and experience. In IELTS Academic Writing Task 1, you'll see a diagram, a visual way of presenting information. You may be shown one or more diagrams. This visual information can be shown as: Table Chart Process Chart Map You will also be given instructions to summarize the information you see by selecting and communicating the basic functions that you see by making comparisons where appropriate. You will need to give the task of transmitting information - the visual information that you are given, should be presented in the form of text. To successfully complete the task you will need: Write an introduction Write a review (summary of what you see) Present time and highlight key features with numbers (data) you will need to write at least 150 words and the answers must be written in full, without bullet points or notes. In Task 2 of the academic writing test, you are asked to write an essay in response to a point of view, argument, or problem. Essays must be written in academic or semi-official clothing. Topics are devoted to topical issues and focus on a specific aspect of the topic. For example, if the topic is about computers, the focus will be on a specific aspect rather than writing about computers in general. Task instructions give you information about the issue by telling you how to discuss the topic in your essay. You may be asked to provide factual information, outlines and submit solutions, substantiate your opinion or evaluate evidence and ideas. It is important that you carefully complete the task by using appropriate ideas and examples to support your position. Your ideas should be organized clearly using paragraphs for each idea. You must write at least 250 words. The questions in the Academic Letter test are different from those in the general preparation of the Writing Test. In the academic task of Letter 1, you will be shown a visual representation of information; graph, table, chart, or chart, and you are asked to generalize, describe, or explain the information you see. Make sure you organize your response to the three main parts, introduction, review, and basic features supported by the numbers from the chart. In Academic Writing Challenge 2, you will be presented in terms of an argument, or problem. Topics can range from the environment to immigration, culture and even technology. You may be asked, agreed or disagreed with a point of view or argument, discuss two opposing points of view, write about the pros or cons of a topic, or explain a given problem, or the cause of the problem, and propose a solution. Your answer to Academic Writing Challenge 2 should be in essay format. The Academic Writing Test is 60 minutes. There are two tasks. Candidates must write at least 150 words for Task 1 and at least 250 words for Task 2. Both answers must be written in a formal style. IELTS Academic Challenge 1Wa will be asked to describe some visual information (graph/table/chart/chart), and present a description in your own words. You may be asked to describe and explain the data, describe the stages of the process, how something works, or write about an object or event. You should write 150 words in about 20 minutes. IELTS Writing Tasks 1 - Common IELTS Sample Letters (IELTS Writing Task 1) The purpose of this section is to help you with writing Task 1 of the IELTS General Test. In Task 1, candidates are asked to respond to a question with a letter requesting information or clarification. It is assumed that the task 1 spends about 20 minutes, which requires candidates to write at least 150 words. Depending on the task, candidates are judged on their ability: - to engage in personal correspondence - to request and provide general factual information - to express needs, desires, sympathies and dislikes - to express opinions (views, complaints, etc.) IELTS Writing Task 2 IELTS Writing Task 2 (IELTS Sample Essay) IELTS Writing Task 2 requires you to write at least 250 words.
