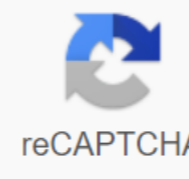

## Major world events in 1963

Historical events of the year 1963 January 2 1963 » Vietnam War: Viet Cong wins its first major victory in the Battle of Ap Bac. 22 January » Elyse cooperation agreement between France and Germany signed by Charles de Gaulle and Konrad Adenauer. January 23 » The War of Independence of Letter-Bissau officially begins when PAIGC guerrilla fighters attack the Portuguese army stationed in Tite (Guinea-Bissau) on behalf of Tite. January 29th » A list of Pro Football Hall of Fame inductees or first inductees into the Pro Football Hall of Fame have been announced. February 8 » Travel, financial and trade deals made by U.S. citizens to Cuba are illegal by the John F. Kennedy administration. February 8 » The developing color television program in the world, publicly advertised, is broadcast in Mexico City by XHGC-TV, Channel 5, due to technical breakthrough progress by Mexican Engineer Guillermo Gonzalez Camarena. February 12 » Construction begins at Gateway Arch in St. Louis. February 27 » The Dominican Republic receives its first democratically elected president, Juan Bosch, since the end of a dictatorship led by Rafael Trujillo. March 13 » Police in Phoenix, Arizona arrest Ernesto Miranda and charge him with kidnap and rape. His conviction is ultimately set aside by the U.S. Supreme Court in *Miranda v. Arizona* March 17 » Mountain Agung broke out about Ball killing more than 1,100 people. March 21 » Alcatraz, a federal prison known as a prison on the island of San Francisco Bay, closes. April 10 » One hundred and twenty-nine American sailors die when the submarine USS Thresher SSN-593 6 sinks into the sea. April 11th » Pope John XXIII questions pace terris, the first encloastic addressed to everyone, not Catholics alone. April 12 » The Soviet Union nuclear submarine Soviet submarine K-33 K-33 collides with the Finnish Finnish merchant ship M/S Finnclipper in the Danish Strait. April 16 » March Luther King, Jr. or Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. pens his letter to Birmingham jail while imprisoned in Birmingham, Alabama for protesting against segregation. April 24 » A selection of HRH Princess Alexandra, the Venerable lady Ogilvy named Princess Alexandra from Kent to Hon Angus Ogilvy at Westminster Abbey in London. 26 April » Libya's amendment to the constitution transforms Libya (the United Kingdom of Libya) into one national unity (The Kingdom of Libya) and allows women to take part in elections. May 2 » Berthold Seliger launches a rocket with three stages and a maximum flight altitude of more than 100 kilometres from Cuxhaven. It is the only probing rocket developed in Germany. May 3 » Police forces in Birmingham, Alabama switches tactics and Birmingham Campaign for Fire Hoses and Police Dogs called reacts with violent force to stop Protesters. Images of violent oppression broadcast around the world by Brin 8. May » March of South Vietnamese soldiers of Catholic President Ngo Dinh Diem Huế Phát Phát Đản shooting open fire on Buddhists defying ban on flying Buddhist flag Vesākha Vesak, killing nine and sparking Buddhist cri May 11 » Islamist bombing in Birmingham, Alabama or Birmingham, disrupting nonviolence in the Birmingham campaign and accelerating the Birmingham crisis with the name of crisis , which includes federal troops. May 13 » U.S. Supreme Court case in *Brady v. Maryland* is doomed. May 14 » Kuwait joins the United Nations. May 15 » What: Launch of the final Mercury mission, Mercury-Atlas 9 with astronaut L. Gordon Cooper on board. He becomes the first American to spend more than one day in space known as space. May 22 » A legital attempt by Greek left-wing politician Grigoris Lambrakis, who will die five days later. May 24 » Baldwin-Kennedy meeting on race relations in the U.S. May 25 » Indisabeba, Ethiopia, an African unity organization is established. June 1 » Kenian gains internal self-government (Madaraka Day). June 3rd » Buddhist crisis: Soldiers from the Army of Vietnam Hue chemical attacks, such as attacking protesting Buddhists in Huế, South Vietnam, with liquid chemicals from tear gas grenades, causing 67 people to be hospitalized for blistering from the skin June 5th » The Bean Secretary of State for War, John Profumo, resigns in a sex scandal known as the Profumo affair. June 5 » 15th Khordad movement: Protests against Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini with the arrest of Iranian shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi. In several cities, masses of angry demonstrators are confronted with tanks and parachutes. 10 June » Equal Pay Act 1963, which aims to close the gender pay gap (see pay gap). It was signed into law on 10 December 1963. June John F. Kennedy as part of his New Frontier Program June 11 » African-American Civil Rights Movement (1954-68) American Civil Rights Movement: Alabama List of Leaders of Alabama Governor George Wallace Stand Schoolhouse Door stands at the door of the Foster Auditorium at the University of Alabama in an attempt June 11 » Decider monk Thích Quảng Đức Self-immolation or burns himself with gasoline at a busy Saigon intersection to protest about the lack of religious freedom in South Vietnam. June 11th » John F. Kennedy addresses Americans from the Oval Office proposing a Civil Rights Act of 1964 that will revolutionize American society. Proposing equal access to public institutions, the ultimate segregation of education and the guarantee of federal protection votin June 12 » The African American Civil Rights Movement (1955-1968), for example, civil rights leader Medgar Evers is killed at his home Jackson, Mississippi with Ku Klux Klan member Byron De La Beckwith. June 16 » Soviet space program: Vostok 6 mission Cosmonauts Valentina Tereshkova becomes the first woman in space. June 17 » A meeting after leaders of South Vietnam called South Vietnamese President Ngo Dinh Diem announced a Joint Communiqué to end the Buddhist crisis, a uprising involving about 2,000 people erupting. One person has been killed. June 20 » A standing Moscow-Washington hotline called the red phone creates a link between the Soviet Union and the United States following the Cuban missile crisis. June 21 » The Cathedral of Giovanni Battista Montini is the Papal Conclave. 1963 known as The Elected Pope Paul VI. 24 June » United Kingdom grants Zanzibar internal self-government. June 26 » U.S. President John F. Kennedy delivered a speech to Ich bin ein Berliner, highlighting U.S. support for democratic West Germany shortly after the Soviet Union called the Soviet-backed Berlin Wall in East Germany. June 26 » Levi Eshkol becomes Prime Minister of Israel. June 30 » Ciaculli massacre: Car bomb designed for Mafia boss Salvatore Greco Ciaschiteddu Salvatore Greco kills seven Polizia di Stato policemen and Italian army military personnel near Palermo. July 1 » Zip codes have been introduced in U.S. Postal Services, such as United States Postal Codes. July 1 » The British government admits that former diplomat Kim Philby had worked for the Soviet Union called Soviet espionage known as an agent. July 7 »sleimism crisis: Police Ngô Đình Nhu, brother and chief political advisor to President Ngô Đình Diệm. Double Seven Day scuffle, for example, attacked a group of American journalists who were on protest. July 12 » Polyne Reade, who was 16 years old, disappears on her way to dance at the British Railways Club in Gorton, England, the first victim of the Moors murder. July 19 » S. Joseph A. Walker or Joe Walker flies a North American X-15 at a record altitude of 106,010 meters (347,800 feet) on X-15 Flight 90. July 22 » Crown colony sarawak for example independence. July 24 » The Ponicated Bluenose II was launched in Lunenburg, Nova Scotia. Schooner is the main symbol of Canada. July 26 » Earthquake in Skopje, Yugoslavia (now the Republic of Macedonia) leaves 1,100 dead. 26 July » Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development votes to host Japan. August 5 » The United States, the United Kingdom and the Soviet Union sign a partial nuclear test ban treaty or a nuclear test ban treaty. August 8 » Great Train Robbery (1963) Great Train Robbery: England, gang of 15 train robbery train robbers steal pound £2.6 million bank August 15th » Henry John Burnett, the last man to be hanged in Scotland. August 15 » President Fulbert Youlou is overthrown in the Republic of Congo after a three-day uprising in the capital was called by The Rabbit Glorieuses (1963). August 18 » The African American civil rights movement (1954-68), known as the American civil rights movement. James Meredith becomes the first black person to graduate from the University of Mississippi. August 21 » Xá Lái Pagoda raids: Army of The Republic of Vietnam special forces loyal to Ngo Dinh Nhu, brother of President Ngo Dinh Diem, vandalizes Buddhism like Buddhist pagodas across the country, arresting thousands and leaving about hundreds dead. August 22 » American Joseph A. Walker Joe Walker's North American X-15 X-15 test plane reaches altitude to turn 106 km mi abbr= on. August 24 »Angle crisis: As a result of Xá Lái Pagoda raids, U.S. State Department Cable 243 named cables U.S. Embassy, Saigon to promote army of Vietnamese generals to 1963 South Vietnam coup named launch coup against The Press August 28 » Lavar on Washington for Jobs and Freedom: Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr. gives his Man dream speech August 28th » Career Girls Murders Emily Hoffer and Jalie Wynice are killed in their Upper East Side Manhattan apartment , prompting events that could lead to the passing of Miranda's warning to Miranda Rights. August 28th » Governor Albert D. Rosellini Bridge-Evergreen Point, like the Evergreen Point Bridge, the longest pontoon bridge known as the floating bridge in the world, opens between Seattle and Medina, Washington, U.S. August 30 » Moscow-Washington hotline between U.S. and Soviet leaders continues to operate. August 31 » North Borneo (now Sabah) to achieve self-government. September 4 » Swissair Flight 306 crashes near Dürrenäsch, Switzerland, killing all 80 people on board. September 6 » International Centre for Industrial Property Studies (CEIPI) is established. September 7th » Pro Football Hall of Fame opens in Canton, Ohio with 17 charter members. September 15th » 16th Street Baptist Church bombing: Four children killed in an African-American church in Birmingham, Alabama, United States September 16th » Malaysia formed from the Federation of Malaya, Singapore, North Borneo (Sabah) and Crown Colony Sarawak like Sarawak. However, Singapore is soon leaving this new country. September 29 » Second period of the Second Vatican Council begins. October 4th » Caine Flora, kills 6,000 in Cuba and Haiti. October 7 » John F. Kennedy signs ratification of a partial test ban treaty. October 9 » In eastern Italy, more than 2,000 people are killed when a major landslide behind The Vajont Dam causes a giant wave of water to overtop it. October 10th » France cedes bizertes naval bases to Tunisia. October 22 » BAC One-Eleven prototype airliner crashes in the UK with the loss of everything on board. October 31 » An explosion at the Indiana State Fair Coliseum (now the Fairgrounds Coliseum known as the Pepsi Coliseum) in Indianapolis kills 74 people and injures another 400 during a skating show. A faulty propane tank connection on the concession stand has been blamed. November 1 » Arecibo Observatory in Arecibo, Puerto Rico, such as Arecibo, Puerto Rico, with the largest radio telescope ever built, officially opens. November 1 » 1963 South Vietnamese coup begins November 2 » South Vietnamese President Ngô Đình Diệm is arresting and murdering Ngô Đình Diệm known as murdered after a military coup. November 6 » Vietnam War: After the 1963 South Vietnames coup known as the November 1 coup and execution of President Ngo Dinh Diem, coup leader General Duong Văn Minh takes over the leadership of South Vietnam. November 7 » Wunder von Lengede: In Germany, eleven miners are rescued from a collapsed mining called mine after 14 days. November 9 » At Mike Coal Mine, Mike District, Fukuoka called Mike, Japan, the explosion kills 458, and hospitalizes 839 with carbon monoxide poisoning. November 18th » First phone with push-button is in use. Nov 22 » Dallas named Dallas, Texas, U.S. President John F. Kennedy is nosleizi and Texas Governor John Connally is seriously injured. Suspect Lee Harvey Oswald was later captured and charged with murder both November 24th » Before the live, television murder, Lee Harvey Oswald, the alleged murderer of President John F. Kennedy, was murdered two days after the murder of Jack Ruby in the basement of the Dallas Police Department headquarters. 27 November » Strasbourg is signed the Convention on the Unification of certain substantive rights issues on patents for inventions. November 29th » The President of the United States such as U.S. President Lyndon B. Johnson sets up the Warren Commission to investigate the assassinate of President John F. Kennedy. November 29 » Trans-Canada Air Lines Flight 831 crashes shortly after takeoff from Montreal-Pierre Elliott Trudeau International Airport or Montreal Dorval International Airport, killing all 118 people on board. December 1 » Gjaland becomes the 16th state of India. December 7 » TheSims replay makes its debut during an American Army Black Knights football called Army-Navy Midshipmen football called a Navy football game. December 8 » Pan Am Flight 214, a Boeing 707, was struck by lightning and crashes near Elkton, Maryland, killing all 81 people on board. 10 December » Zanzibar acquires independence from the United Kingdom as a constitutional monarchy, according to Sultan Jamshid bin Abdullah of Zanzibar or bin Abdullah. 12 December » Kenya gains independence from the United Kingdom. December 14 » A bambis containing Baldwin Hills Reservoir bursts, killing five people and damaging hundreds of homes in Los Angeles known as Los Angeles, California. December 22 » Cruise ship TSMs Lakonia Lakonia burns to turn 180 km north of Madeira, Portugal with the loss of 128 lives. 25 December » Turkish Cypriot Bayrak Radio begins broadcasting in Cyprus after Turkish Cypriots are forcibly expelled from the Cyprus Broadcasting Corporation. December 31 » Asia Rhodesia and Nyasaland named central African Federation officially collapse, after becoming Zambia, Malawi and Rhodesia. It's Rodley.
