I could show her a little bit about where I traveled in a way that was fun and engaging for her. I think that reading children's books about other cultures can help children see the world from home and give them some idea of future vacations with family. If you are planning to visit Nepal with your children, or just want to show them a piece of peace that is different, then their own, I highly recommend these books. Note: I am not a teacher and do not know the reading levels of children, so I have added the recommended age for books based on reviews. Everest: The wonderful story of Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay Alexandra Stewart is recommended for ages 4 and before this book came with rave reviews from children and adults, so that makes it a great book for the whole family. What's special about this book is how both climbers are in the spotlight. The book is full of funny facts and gives an insight into the lives of Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay from the beginning of their lives to the end. This is a story about how two very different people could come together to accomplish the impossible. A dog named Haku Margarita Engle recommended for 5-9-year-old dog named Haku is the story of two young Nepali boys celebrating Tihar Nepal. Tihar is a five-day holiday in which one day the dogs are celebrated for being a security guard and a companion to people. On this day dogs are fed with special treats and give floral garlands. Many dogs have helped in rescue efforts since the 2015 earthquake, and these two boys are on the lookout for a stray dog to feed to say thank you. They end up finding an adorable puppy named Haku who they take home with them. This story is about being grateful and cultural traditions. Children can also have fun learning a few Nepalese words at the back of the book. The Adventures of Nepalese Frog Kanak Mani Dixit is Recommended for 4-10 Years This Nepalese book is the story of an adventurous story about a young frog who wants to see the world. The main character comes from the Nepalese expression: The Frog kathmandu, which refers to someone who has spent his entire life in Kathmandu. Inspired by the journey, the frog takes off to see parts of Nepal including the Himalayas and Chitwan National Park. Along the way, he encounters many characters who help him on his journey. Every day when she goes to school, she transfers people from all walks of life from trekkers to porters. She greets each of them with a smile and a Nepalese greeting Namaste. It means that the light in me recognizes the light in you. Her bright smile and true meaning behind her brings light to all those she welcomes. This story teaches children the importance of kindness and how a smile can make a difference. First to the top: Sir Edmund Hillary's Amazing Everest Adventures David Hill Recommended for 4-8-Year-Olds First to the Top tells the story of Sir Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay's first climb on Everest. It is a story about the determination, friendship and trust established in the Himalayas. While many adults know the history of the first summit of Everest, it is a new story for children who can ooohhh and ahhhh on the delights of mountaineering. Children also get a glimpse into the world of mountaineering, like how oxygen is less at altitude, which opens the book up to further discussion about science. The Magic Light of Chandra: A Story in Nepal by Teresa Heine Featured for 5-8-Year-Olds This book is a story about two young girls who discover that a solar lantern can help their brother get better. He is sick of kerosene vapors. This book has a positive message about girl entrepreneurs as they raise money to buy a lamp by selling rhododendron flowers. It also has a positive environmental lesson. This Nepalese story book highlights the difference in around around and as in some areas there is no electricity. Jack and Betty and Yak and Yeti Simon Arlie recommended for 3-5 years This was the first Nepalese history book I ever came into contact with. I bought it for my 3 year old niece when I got home from Kathmandu. The story tells the story of a brother and sister who want to climb to the top of the world, which is Mount Everest. While some words can be hard to pronounce for those who haven't been to Nepal, it was fun for me to read it and show her the places I've been. Jack and Betty and The Tigers Tale of Simon Arlie featured for 3-5 years the second book featuring the brother of sister duo Jack and Betty. This takes place in the jungle where the couple tries to save the tigers. This tale has a great message for endangered animals and why it is important to save them. I also bought this book for my 3 year old niece, but felt it might be a little above her comprehension. Now she's 4 years old, and I think maybe at 5 years old she'll be able to understand the environmental message of this a little bit more. I see the sun in Nepal Dedi King recommended for ages 5 and before this book takes place in Bandipur, Nepal, where a young local girl goes through the daily life of a Nepalese child. This is a great book to show children from all over the world that children around the world have similarities, but it also shows differences in cultures. The book gives children the opportunity to learn about Nepalese cuisine and culture. It is also printed in Nepalese and English on the pages. Part of the proceeds from this book has been donated to the Bundipur Training Centres in Nepal. Zack Yak with books on the back of John Woods Recommended for 7-9-year-old zack Yak is a story about a yak in Nepal who hears about children in nearby villages who don't have any books to read. It's a story that can help children appreciate the privilege of learning and help them understand that in some parts of the world it's harder. This is a funny rhyming book with interesting illustrations. While this Nepalese book story is cute in itself, the proceeds of the book go to the room to read, which helps give books in areas of the world with limited resources for libraries. Sari my mother Sandhya Rao recommended for 4-6-year-olds This book is a picture of a child's love for her mother's sari. Although this book is about Indian culture, women in Nepal also wear sarees, and I found that it is just as appealing to those who have learned or visiting Nepal. The book tells about how important a mother's sari is to the baby, and all the many uses a child can have for it. The book is known for its beautiful illustrations. My mother's sari can be used to teach children different cultures and styles of clothing. Betty and Ella Burfoot's Yeti Recommended for 5-8-Year-Olds Isn't Really About Nepal, This Children's Book About Betty decides to walk in the snow. Along the way, she discovers why she needs extra clothes while the cold weather animals are gone. She ends up being friends with a yeti (rumored to exist in the Himalayas) and discovers that you can't judge someone by their appearance. While the youthie seems scary, he just wants to be friends. This story teaches children how to make friends and facts about animals living in cold climates. To the market! To the market! India, but the market's lively kiosks are similar to the Ason Market in bustling Kathmandu. The book is about a young girl who goes to the local market with her mother. She's got some cash to buy something for herself and spends most of the day fancying all the options as she passes various stalls.
