With the cost of school supplies rising and the amount of supplies requested from schools rising, it is getting more expensive to buy school supplies every year. If you have multiple school-age children then your fees can easily reach hundreds of dollars each year. Whether you're a parent who can't find money in your budget to buy school supplies this year, or you're trying to stretch your budget, see below to find some ways you can get free school supplies for your kids this year. Your first step to getting free school supplies should be to contact your child's school. Often schools will buy additional supplies each year that they can provide for families who can't afford them. Sometimes teachers themselves will use a portion of their class budget to purchase additional equipment for their students. If you are unlucky with your child's individual school, you should contact your school district. Many school districts have programs set up where communities can donate school supplies that they can then give to families who need them. If they don't have a program set up, they'll likely have information about citywide programs that provide free school supplies. Reaching out to the community should be your next step in getting free school supplies. All kinds of organizations set up programs to provide school supplies, you just have to find out who they are in your community. You can contact your local news stations and newspapers. This is who the organization that provides school supplies contacts when they want to get news about their programs. If your local media is not aware of any programs, they will most likely be able to make foot gestures to find out where they are. others who frequently set up free school supply programs include local universities, churches, and charities such as Volunteer America and United Way. If you're a military family, Operation Homefront partners with Dollar Tree every year to provide free backpacks and school supplies. You can apply for the Back-to-School Brigade to take this fantastic program. If you want to stretch your school budget, watching it for free after rebates will help you score some free school supplies. Many stores offer deals after free rebates on school supplies and you should watch your Sunday circular to see if there are any offers for this week. Staples has a program called Easy Rebates that makes it very easy to get free school supplies during July and August. Items after free rebates can make store money because so many people forget to send rebates. Make sure you send out rebates so you get your money back or your school supplies won't be free after all. Feel free to take advantage of free school supplies after rebates that are not on your child's school supply list this year. Get rid of it for next year or better yet, donate it. Going back to school shopping is great business for shops and they want to get you in and spend money. They'll often have doorbusters to get you in the door. They expect you to buy all your school supplies there but that doesn't mean you have to. OfficeMax/Office Depot and Staples often have school supplies that sell for 1, 10, 50, and \$1. Sometimes they also have coupons in their ads to help you save more money. If you're like most parents, you have a drawer or even a closet full of school supplies that you've bought in the past but that you probably won't need anymore. Consider holding a school supply exchange where parents in your school district or neighborhood bring school supplies they don't need and exchange them for what they do. If you can't get free school supplies, you can definitely get them cheap. To do that, you'll need to shop in more than one place, watch ads, and use coupons. If you go to one place and get all the school supplies you need, you will pay more money than you need to. You'll want to start watching newspaper ads in July and start visiting every store to pick up just a really good deal. Pay special attention to Walmart, Kmart, Big Lots, Target, Walgreens and grocery stores ads to get back to school sales. These stores will have some items which is an excellent deal every week. If you don't get a newspaper, you can view and subscribe to all these ads online. Coupons are helpful in saving school supplies as well. Watch your Sunday newspaper coupons and often to see if any coupons appear for school supplies. Combine this with sales and you'll actually save cash. Another way to save on school supplies is to take advantage of tax-free weekends that many states have to help ease the cost of school supplies and others back to school items. Red pens and pencils are used to assess other students' assignments. Pencil boxes It's important to stay organized. Backpacks Many schools require students to use a clear backpack. Your pencil sharpener will need it for the day of the test! Your bookmarks will read more sophisticated books. Colored pencils Students begin learning geography in fourth grade in much larger detail. Colored pencils will be used for maps and other projects. The Student ruler starts working with graphics in fourth grade. Geometry is also a subject that students will explore in depth.
