The brand's website states that these phones use clinical grade technology that has been adapted for safe and efficient use. In case you are new for laser hair removal, the heat of the laser kills the hair follicles so that it hair does not regrow over time. The product description states that it takes 4 to 5 weeks to notice a proper difference in hair density and growth, and about 10 to 12 weeks for the hair to be completely gone. It has five intensity parameters. This means that you can adjust how much you really want to wrist hair follicles. This also means that you can reduce intensity on more sensitive areas. Unfortunately, the two main downfalls of this product are that those with dark skin tones can't use your phone and you can't laser over tattoos. You can't laser deep skin tones because the light from the laser won't be able to properly penetrate darker skin. You can't use a laser on tattoos because the laser attracts dark pigment and scatters the ink. One sure positive is that Happy Skin Co offers a 10-year warranty on its IPL Laser Hair Removal Handset. Not many retailers offer a guarantee of this length and it just shows that the brand has a lot of confidence in its product. Week 1: Now that you know what we're dealing with, let's get into juicy stuff. After reading the user manual I realized that I first needed to scrub with my fake tan and shave area which I was going to laser. It's actually no different from conventional laser services, but removing fake tan is always a pain. The user's guide stated that I should use the phone once a week and that there is no point in using it more often because the hair follicle has not grown yet. The process was a lot easier than I expected. You just plug it in, turn it on and set the intensity level. The phone has a sensor that tells you when it is pressed to your skin and a little pink light flashes. You press the button and bam, laser. When I told people about this product, everyone asked: Does it hurt? Honestly, I had a laser on the highest set and it didn't hurt at all. You feel a small amount of heat and that's it. You can go the same area up to three times, but I'm just stuck to do it once for my first go. It took me about 30-40 minutes to do my whole body, it was even faster than I expected -- and I had quite thick hair. Some areas were definitely a little more sensitive, but it's super easy to adjust the intensity level. Now I know you don't have to. see the results instantly, but Holy Moli. After that only once my skin felt so ridiculously soft and my tan never went on so flawlessly. Also, I noticed a difference in how quickly my hair grew from the first go. Usually after shaving I can start to feel some spikes after two days. It was six days until I felt like I needed to shave, and for me, it's totally unheard of. Week 5: In week five, I felt like I had found my true love. My phone and I were now in a devoted relationship. I've seen a significant difference in body hair. Not only is it thinner and lighter, but the time it takes to grow backwards is getting longer and longer. Is that magic? No, it's science.
