These days, government offices, embassies and some shops are closed. If the date of observance falls on a weekend, the following Monday will be a day off instead of the holiday. National Christmas holidays, in addition to New Year's Day (Новый год Novy god) on January 1, January 2-5 are also holidays.[1][2] called new year's holiday (Новогодние каникулы Novogodniye kanikuly). The holiday includes January 6 and 8, with Christmas January 7 declared as non-working days by law. Until 2005, only January 1 and 2 were holidays. [3] Orthodox Christmas Day Main article: Christmas in Russia Other information: Christmas traditions Christmas in Russia (Рождество Притово Rozhdestvo Khristovo) is celebrated on December 25 Julian calendar that falls on January 7 Gregorian calendar and celebrates the birth of Jesus Christ. The holiday was reinstated in 1991, after decades of suppression of religion and state atheism of the Soviet Union. Defender of The Fatherland Day Defender (День защитника Отечества or Den zashchitnika Otechestva) is celebrated on February 23 and is dedicated to veterans and members of the Armed Forces of the Russian Federation, although it is often colloquially known as Men's Day (День Мужин, Deni' Muzhchin) and commonly treated as a celebration of all men. The holiday was created in 1918. International Women's Day On the eve of World War I campaigning for peace, Russian women observed their first International Women's Day on the last Sunday of February 1913. In 1913, after discussions, International Women's Day was moved to March 8 and has remained the global date for International Women's Day ever since. Spring and Labor Day More information: International Labor Day § Russia In the former Soviet Union, May 1 was International Labor Day and was celebrated with large parades in cities like Moscow. Although the celebrations low-key nowadays, several groups march that day to protest the complaints that workers have. Since 1992, May Day is officially called Spring and Labor Day. Victory Day May 9, Russia celebrates victory over Nazi Germany, remembering those who died to reach it. On May 9, 1945 (by Moscow's time) the German military surrendered to the Soviet Union and the Allies of World War II in Berlin (Karlshorst). Victory Day (День Победы Den Pobedy) is by far one of the biggest Russian holidays. It commemorates those who died in World War II and pays tribute to survivors and veterans. Flowers and wreaths are placed on wartime tombs and special parties and concerts are organized for veterans. At night there is a fireworks display. A huge ground and air military parade, organized by the President of the Russian Federation, is organized annually in Moscow on Red Square. Similar land, air and sea parades (if possible) are organized in several other Russian cities (which are hero cities or have a military district or fleet's main host). Russia Day Russia Day (День России Den Rossii) National Day, celebrated on June 12. On this day, in 1991, the Russian parliament formally declared russian sovereignty of the Soviet Union. The holiday was officially established in 1992. It was initially named The Day of adoption of the Declaration of Sovereignty of the Russian Federation, on 1 February 2002 it was officially renamed to Russia Day (in 1998 Boris Yeltsin offered this name socially). In Russian society there is a misconception that this holiday is also called Russia Independence Day, but never had such a name in official documents. According to a Levada Center survey in May 2009, 44% of respondents named the holiday as Russia's Independence Day. Unity Day (День народного единства Den narodnogo edinstva) was first celebrated on November 4, 2005, commemorates the popular uprising led by Kuzma Minin and Dmitry Pozharsky who drove the Polish invaders out of Moscow in November 1612, and more generally the end of the Troubles And Foreign Intervention in Russia. The event was marked by a holiday that was held in Russia on October 22 (Old Style) from 1649 until 1917. His name alludes to the idea that all classes of Russian society voluntarily united to preserve the Russian state when his death seemed inevitable, although there was neither tsar nor patriarch to guide them. Most observers see this as an attempt to replace communist demonstrations on the November 7 holiday, which marked the anniversary of the October Revolution. National Unity Day is also known as Consolidation Day (as a alternative), that people in Russia celebrate on 3 and 4 November.
