


Set up new iphone manually

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Learn how to set up your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch. Tap and hold the device power button until you see the Apple logo. Then you will see Hello in many languages. Follow the steps to get started. If you're blind or visually impaired, you can turn on VoiceOver or zoom in from the Hello screen. When asked, choose your own language. Then tap your country or region. This affects the appearance of information on the device, including date, time, contacts, and more. At this point, you can press the blue availability button to customize availability settings that can optimize the way you set up and use a new device. Get help if your device doesn't turn on, or if it's disabled or your password is required. If you have another device that runs iOS 11 or later, you can use it to automatically customize your new device with a quick start. Take the two devices close together and then follow the instructions. If you don't have another device with iOS 11 or later, click the Settings button manually to continue. You can set up Face ID or Touch ID on some devices. With these features, you can use facial recognition or fingerprints to unlock your device and shop. Click Continue and follow the instructions, or click Set later in the settings. Then set a six-digit password to protect your data. You need a password to use features such as Face ID, Touch ID and Apple Pay. If you want a four-digit password, custom password or no password, click Options passwords. If you have a backup iCloud or iTunes or An Android device, you can recover or transfer data from your old device to a new device. If you don't have a backup or other device, select Don't share apps and data. Enter your Apple ID and password or click the Lost Password or don't have an Apple ID? From there, you can restore your Apple ID or password, create an Apple ID or set it up later. If you use multiple Apple Identifiers, click use different Apple ID IDs for iCloud and iTunes? When you sign up for Apple ID, you may be asked to check the verification code from your previous device. On the following screens, you can decide whether to share information with app developers and allow iOS to be updated automatically. Next, you'll be asked to customize or include services and features such as Siri. On some devices, you'll be asked to do a few phrases so Siri can recognize your voice. If you've signed up with an Apple ID, follow apple Pay and iCloud Keychain. Screen Time gives you an idea of how much time you and your kids spend on your devices. It also allows you to set deadlines for daily use of apps. Once you've set up Screen Time, you can turn on True Tone if your device supports it, and use the zoom display to customize the size of icons and text on your home screen. If you have an iPhone X or later, learn more about using gestures to navigate your device. If you have an iPhone 7, 7, 7 Plus, iPhone 8, or iPhone 8 Plus, you can adjust the click for the Home button. With a quick start, you can quickly set up a new iOS or iPadOS device using information from your current device. If you're setting up a new device with your current device, and your current device is using iOS 12.4 or later or iPadOS, Fast Start offers the option of using a migration from device to device. This allows you to transfer all data wirelessly from your current device to a new one. A quick start takes both devices, so make sure you choose a time when you won't need to use your current device for a few minutes. Turn on the new device and place it next to the current device. The quick-start screen is displayed on your current device and offers the option of using an Apple ID to customize your new device. Make sure it's the Apple ID you want to use and then click Continue. If you don't see the opportunity to continue working on your current device, make sure Bluetooth is on. Wait for the animation to appear on the new device. Keep the current device above the new device, then center the animation in the viewfinder. Wait for the message, it says, Finish on a new device. If you can't use the current device's camera, click Authenticate manually and then follow the appearing steps. When requesting, enter the password of your current device on your new device. Follow the instructions for setting up Face ID or Touch ID on your new device. If you request, enter your Apple ID password on your new device. If you have multiple devices, you may also have to enter their passwords. The new device offers the choice of transferring data from one device to another, or restoring apps, data, and settings from the last iCloud backup. You can also click other options to recover from backup on your computer. Once you've selected a backup, you can choose whether to transfer some settings related to location, privacy, Apple Pay, and Siri. If you have an Apple Watch and you're setting up a new iPhone, you're also asked if you want to share data and Settings with your Apple Watch. If your current iPhone or using iOS 12.4 or later or iPadOS, you can use the device's migration to your device to transfer data directly from the previous device to the new one. You Are You do this wirelessly, or by connecting devices along with the cable. To move your data over the wireless network, keep your previous device close to the new one throughout the process if you follow the steps below. Make sure to keep both devices connected to power. Turn on the new device and place it next to a current device that uses iOS 12.4 or later or iPadOS. You can also choose whether to move some settings, such as Apple Pay and Siri, from your previous device to your new iPhone or iPad. If you have an Apple Watch and you're setting up a new iPhone, you're asked if you want to transfer data and settings to the Apple Watch. Keep your devices close to each other and connect them to power until the iPhone data migration process is complete. Transfer times can vary depending on factors such as the type of connection you use, network conditions, and the amount of data being transmitted. You can choose a wired method if the wireless network you are using is slow or congested. To transfer data from one iPhone to another via a wired connection, get lightning on a USB 3 camera adapter and lightning to a USB cable, then follow these steps: Connect lightning to a USB 3 camera adapter to power through your lightning port. Make sure to use a 12W or higher power adapter. Connect Lightning to the USB 3 Camera Adapter to your current iPhone. Connect Lightning to a USB cable in your new iPhone and then connect the other end to the adapter. Continue by following the steps above. Migratory data is only supported by a wired connection on the iPhone. If your new iPhone is registered with apple Manager School or Apple Business Manager, you can't use a fast start to transfer data with the current iPhone. Thank you for your feedback. Turn on and customize your new iPhone through an internet connection. You can also set up your iPhone by plugging it into your computer. Do one of the following: Click the setting manually and then follow the settings instructions on the screen. If you have another iPhone, iPad or iPod touch with iOS 11, iPadOS 13 or later, you can use a quick start to automatically customize your new device. Bring the two devices closer together and then follow the instructions on the screen to safely copy many of your settings, preferences and iCloud Keychain. You can then recover the rest of the data and contents of the new device from the iCloud backup. Or, if both devices have iOS 12.4, iPadOS 13 or later, you can transfer all data wirelessly from the previous device to the new one. Keep the devices next to each other and connect them to power until the migration process is complete. You can also transmit your data via a wired connection between devices. Watch Fast Start to transfer data from your previous iOS device to your new iPhone, iPad or iPod touch. If you're blind or visually impaired, press the side button three times (on your iPhone with Face ID) or press home three times (on other iPhone models) to turn on VoiceOver, the screen reader. You can also double-click on the screen with three fingers to turn on zoom. When you first set up a new iPhone, you can automatically and safely move data from your Android device. On the Android version 4.0 or later, watch Apple's Support article Move from Android to iPhone, iPad or iPod touch and download the Move to iOS app. On your iPhone, do the following: Follow the installation assistant.
