Lesson: Church History or other context. Class Level or Age Group: I did this event with twelve class students in the context of church history class. It is adaptable for young students ... Course Objectives: Students will be invited to refect at Nicene Creed and write their own beliefs. Required Materials: Content/Events: N.B.: If you are doing this activity outside the context of the church history lesson, go to the following 1 and 2. Introduce students to the events that led to the Nicene Creed formulation. The following documents available at www can be useful here: 2. Distribute copies of the Apostle's Creed and Nicene Creed to students. In groups of three or four, ask them: a. To compare two denominations - the following questions can be useful in directing this process: How do the two denominations look alike? What's the difference? What was added to Nicene Creed about Jesus? b. To try to come up with an explanation for the difference between the two denominations - ask them to justify their hypothesis. Can you direct students' attention by asking a series of additional questions? What role did Arian's heresy play in nicene creed's formulation? How do you tell how Nicene Creed was written? Why did the bishops at Nicea Council insist on certain points in their faith? 3. After groups share their answers with the rest of the class, distribute a copy of my Creed worksheet to each student. (If you want to allow them to be creative about it, you may want to express articles of faith to draw a coat of coat of ation with illustrations and words. NB: You can expand this activity to include a reflection of the connection between today's faith and historical events. You can also analyze the Apostle's Creed with students to show that there is a partial response to gnosticism (see The Apostles' Creed: With notes from James E. Kiefer). Print each piece on a separate piece of paper or index card. Mix the paper/cards and give each child one. By holding the paper/card in front, each child is sorted in the appropriate order. Search your part. Repeat until Nicene Creed is memorized. Illustrated Verse- Ask To draw pictures of words that help them remember the word in Nicene Creed. Put drawings together by repeating words using visual cues. Keep going until you find out about Nicene Creed on a chalk or whiteboard by missing the basic words. Give each student a missing keyword card from Nicene Creed. Ask students to place their word cards in the appropriate place, as they say Nicene Creed. Mix the cards and repeat until you know nicene Creed. Photo A Verse - Write words on separate construction papers to Nicene Creed. Take a picture of every kid holding a line to Nicene Creed. Children then use the pictures to edit the words in the appropriate order for nicene Creed. Tape it to the poster board. Verse Chain- Nicene Creed's print lines on separate paper strips. Give each child a strip. After repeating Nicene Creed several times with children, ask nicene creed in turn to mount the chain by putting the words. Staple the chain together.
