Mr. Lentz points out exactly that 99.9% of his ministry is for people who are not celebrities, so it is seriously wrong to call him a celebrity pastor. Secondly, this book is not just for Christians, again, Mr. Lentz himself makes this moment-it's a book for everyone. Frame is an author, here are some things I learned about life, much of it through the mistakes I made, and yes, I'm a Christian and write it from a Christian point of view, but even if you're not a Christian, join me for a ride and see what you think. If Mr. Lentz had not been a pastor, he would certainly have had a career as a motivational speaker, because it is his gift. He has some pretty interesting anecdotes, such as clambering around New York in the middle of the night, trying to find a place to baptize Justin Bieber, who decided he should be baptized. They ended up baptizing it in Tyson Chandler's excessive bathroom at something like 4am. He tells a different story (with the permission of Keven Durant) about how he played 2-on-2 with Kevin Durant as his partner (against two NBA players), how Mr. Lentz lost it to them, taking a shot and missing, and how angry Kevin Durant was that Mr. Lentz didn't pass it on to him. Indeed, when Mr. Lentz asks Mr. Durant if he can put this story in his book, Mr. Durant's answer is: Yes, no problem, by the way, I'm still that we lost this game!
