The exchange was cheerful until a girl, a great newcomer, refused my card – she peremptorily, with a glance. Then it dawned on me with a certain suddenness that I was different from the others; or how, can, in heart and life and longing, but locked out of their world by a huge veil. After that, I had no desire to tear down this veil, to sneak through; I kept everything in common contempt and lived above it in a region with blue skies and large wandering shadows. This sky was bluest when I could beat my mates in exam time, or beat them in a foot race or even hit their string heads. Unfortunately, over the years all this fine contempt began to fade; for the words which I longed for, and all their dazzling possibilities, belonged to them, not mine. But they should not keep those prices, I said; some, all, I would snatch from them. As I would, I could never decide: by reading The Law, healing the sick, by telling the wonderful stories that swam in my head—in some way. For other black boys, the argument wasn't so fiercely sunny: their youth shrank into tasteless or in silent hatred of the pale world over them and mocked distrust of all whites; or wasted in a bitter cry: Why did God make me an outcast and stranger in my own house?
