For most people breaking or losing a phone means they are out a few hundred dollars, but the real cost of the data. It can be scheduled to run automatically every day, week or month, with the additional manual backup option whenever you want. As you back up WhatsApp Tap three points in the top right corner, then Settings. Tap chats and then chat back up at the bottom. Set up WhatsApp backup settings. At the top of the screen you'll see when your last WhatsApp backup has been created, as well as the ability to back up right away. Make sure to do this on WiFi if possible as backup media can use a lot of mobile data.
