The research and work needed to discover pioneers and their descendants aims to promote and encourage a growing interest in those who in any way - large or small - have contributed to the creation of the county, as well as its customs, culture, genealogy and history. Requirements for membership in the first families of Warren County, Ohio current members of the Warren County Genealogical Society (WCGS) may apply for membership in the first families in Warren County. Applicants for the first families must complete an application form showing the Warren County Pioneer Ant(s), listing the ancestry of the Pioneer Ant(s), and proving their ancestry and Pioneer Ant(s) settlement in the area now known as Warren County by January 1, 1821. Applications are due by March 1. The first families of Warren County application must accompany copies of all necessary documents: to prove the pioneering (s) settlement in the county on January 1, 1821; and each descending step from the pioneer(s) to the applicant member. The evidence can't be left out at any stage. These copies of the document must be either a photocopier, a photograph or other copies of the original; either accurately typed or hand-printed copies of the original document, certified true copies by a court officer, genealogical librarian, or other official. All evidence documents must show the source. To apply for membership in the warren county first families, download and print the First Families application form in pdf format. Original application form for membership for the first families in Warren County must be accompanied by a \$15.00 application fee, which includes many Pioneer Anores who settled in Warren County on December 31, 1820, as the applicant can prove either at the time or later. Write to an app. Applications are due by March 1. Please also submit a 5 generation origin table and the corresponding family group records. First families were created as a two-hundred-year tribute to Cincinnati's 200th birthday. The membership consists of nearly 450 descendants who have documented more than 1,000 pioneering ancestors. The northwestern area was founded in July 1787. Hamilton County became the second county, organized in 1790. The first permanent settlers arrived in 1788 at the mouth of the Little Miami River on the Ohio River. From 1790 to 1803, the boundaries of the county changed ten times. At one time, the county stretched as far north as Canada and west toward Indiana. After Ohio was 17th in 1803, ohio was the 17th state to win the World War. If your ancestors lived within the boundaries of Hamilton County between 1790 and 1820, you are eligible to be drafted into the Hamilton County First Families. The rules and application procedures are the same for both lineage companies. These rules and procedures shall be reviewed before the application can be submitted.
