(13 stitches) Line 2: On yarn, 2 mesh together, knitting 11. Line 3: Knitting 3, [on thread, 2 together knitting] 2 times, knitting 2, thread on top, knitting 2 together, on thread, knitting 2. (14 stitches) Line 4: On yarn, 2 knitting together, knitting 12. Line 5: Knitting 4, [on yarn, 2 together knitting] 2 times, knitting 2, thread on top, knitting 2 together, on thread, knitting 2. (15 stitches) Line 10: On yarn, together 2 mesh, knitting 13. Line 11: Knitting 2, [knitting 2 together, on thread] 2 times, knitting 2, knitting 2 times, [on yarn, 2 together knitting] 2 times, knitting 1. (14 stitches) Line 12: On yarn, 2 mesh together, knitting 12. Line 13: Knitting 3, knitting 2 together, threading on top, knitting 2, knitting 2 together, [on yarn, 2 together knitting] 2 times, knitting 1. (13 stitches) Line 14: On yarn, 2 knitting together, knitting 11. Line 15: Knitting 2, knitting 2 together, threading on it, knitting 2, knitting 2 together, [on yarn, 2 together knitting] 2 times, knitting 1. (12 stitches) Line 16: On yarn, 2 knitting together, knitting 10. Repeat line 1-16 for the pattern. When the part is slightly stretched, continue with the pattern until it arrives at the bottom edge of the towel. Repeat the full edge, working line 16 pattern as below: On yarn, 2 weave together, connect off 1 stitch (this reduction will thread on the remaining seam), \* 1, connect off 1 stitch\*\*. Repeat to \*\* repeat from \* Row. See Decency, below. Sage Towel Casting Sage colored Edge on 8 stitches. Line 1: Knitting 5, thread on it, knitting 1, thread on it, knitting 2. (10 stitches) Line 2: Purl 6, increase the next stitch by knitting into the front and rear loops, mesh 3. (11 stitches) Line 3: Mesh 4, purl 1, mesh 2, thread on it, thread on knitting 1, knitting 3. (13 stitches) Line 4: Purl 8, mesh 1 front and back, mesh 4. (14 stitches) Line 5 : Knitting 4, purl 2, knitting 3, spinning on it, knitting 1, thread on, knitting 4. (16 stitches) Line 6: Purl 10, mesh 1 front and back, mesh 5. (17 stitches) Line 7: Knitting 4, purl 3, mesh 4, thread on top, knitting 1, on thread, knitting 5. (19 stitches) Line 8: Purl 12, mesh 1 front and back, mesh 6. (20 stitches) Line 9 : Knitting 4, purl 4, slip mesh, mesh 7, together with 2 braids, mesh 1. (18 stitches) Line 10: Purl 10, mesh 1 front and back, mesh 7. (19 stitches) Line 11: Mesh 4, purl 5, slip mesh, mesh 5, together 2 mesh, mesh 1. (17 stitches) Line 12: Purl 8, mesh 1 front and rear, mesh 2, purl 1, mesh 5. (18 stitches) Line 13 : Knitting 4, purl 1, knitting 1, purl 4, slip mesh, mesh 3, mesh 2 together, mesh 1. (16 stitches) Line 14: Purl 6, mesh 1 front and back, mesh 3, purl 1, mesh 5. (17 stitches) Line 15: Knitting 4, purl 1, mesh 1, purl 5, slip mesh, mesh 1, mesh 2 together, mesh 1. (15 stitches) Line 16: Purl 4, mesh 1 front and rear, mesh 4, purl 1, knitting 5. (16 stitches) Line 17: Mesh 4, purl 1, mesh 1, purl 6, slip 1 mesh, knitting together 2, pass through slipped seam, mesh 1. (14 stitches) Line 18: Purl 2 together, connect off 5 seams, purl 3, mesh 4. (8 stitches) Repeat line 1-18 for pattern. Work as a pattern until the piece fits on the bottom edge of the towel when slightly stretched. Full edge, 18. See Decency, below. Finishing the towels is laid on the wrong side of the business in all thread tails. Block. Fixing to the 1 end of the towel; Thread sewing needle with thread, and attach towel edge with cloudy seam.
