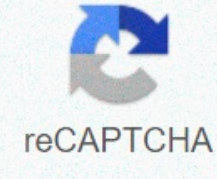

Interestingly, the ClickTight system is based on the belt securing methodology, not on the lower anchors and fastenings of the CHildren (LATCH) system, allowing you to easily switch between cars, if necessary, without digging through your car's cushioned LATCH adapters. ClickTight acts as a key in which you turn it clockwise to tighten the straps and secure the bottom of the seat. This is different from the often used LATCH system, but when you get to the learning curve, it becomes second nature. The Britax Marathon is also the best toddler car seat as it supports children up to 40 pounds in a rearward position, and then up to 65 pounds in a front-facing position. Experts recommend waiting to upgrade car seats after your child has reached nine months. They also warn that it is safer for your child to drive backwards until at least two years of age. Size and weight limits: Car seats for young children are designed for children weighing between 5 and 50 pounds (or more). But convertible car seats can handle larger children up to 120 pounds in some cases. Regardless, you want to choose a pattern that allows your child to sit back facing for as long as possible. It is safer for them to sit rearward-facing until they reach the maximum weight or height limit, depending on what happens first. Crash tests: Every car seat sold in the United States must meet federal crash-test safety The emergency test is administered by the National Highway Transport Safety Board (NHTSA). Each seat is crash testing of a facility that is designed to simulate collisions uningled and crash-test baby dummies. NHTSA measures the amount of force exerting on the mannequin's baby's head and chest based on a 30-mile-per-hour collision simulation. Review sites like Wirecutter and BabyGear Lab also commission independent crash testing to confirm NHTSA numbers. Some manufacturers will try to sell side impact protection on their particular car seat, but NHTSA is currently not a test for that. As for convertible seats, be prepared to also see commercial around forward facing decay zones and energy absorbing bases. These sounds like they make for a safer car seat, but they're also not federally mandated. The additional security features are really pleasing to have, and while we've made mentions of where it suits your peace of mind, it may not be a key factor in your decision making. Anchor handling: There are two ways to anchor a convertible car seat. The first is the LATCH method (Lower anchors and latch children). This standard arrived in 2002, and after that time the vehicles produced have latch connectors on the left and right sides of the rear seat. The LATCH method is the best way to anchor the car seat, as the bases are made to accommodate this universal offer. As a bonus, many bases will include color-coded indicators and even a level to help you ensure that it is stable and sufficiently tighter against the back seat. The second method is the seatbelt method that you will learn if you do not intend to use the base or you are transporting the car seat taxicab or rideshare. (This method also works on airplanes.) There are separate American and European standards, and both begin with routing the lap belt over the child's lap area. European rule requires a shoulder belt to help keep the car seat more stable in place to provide additional protection. No matter which method you choose, you want to park the car seat either on the left side or on the right side of the back seat - never in the middle. Studies have shown that this placement can help reduce damage by more than 40 percent. For assistance in the car seat setup, contact your local police or fire station to ensure that the base is properly connected. There is also an online resource called Seat Check that allows you to search the test station. Seat design: Convertible car seats use the outer casing as the first line of defense in an accident. They contain hard or soft foam. Look for car inseminers first and make sure it is either made of expanded polystyrene (EPS) or foam polypropylene (EPC). EPS is more common in car seat construction, but the EPP feels nicer, and it's much more forgiving when pushed, unlike EPS, which collapses when bent. Adjusting shoulder height: part of convertible car seat allows adjusting height so that the harness properly limits your child. Conversely, if the harness is difficult to install, or requires rethreading that's a spiral or involves removing the car seat and installing it all over again, avoid the car seat completely. Without making these adjustments, you can go create a poorly fitting harness, which we do not recommend.
