She writes: The most common emotion they express is repentance: repentance for never having time to mend broken friendships and relationships; lament that they never told their friends and family how much they care; lament that they will be remembered by their children as hypercritical mothers or demanding and authoritarian fathers. Based on this experience, Periyakoil launched the Stanford Friends and Family Letter Project. It is basically an initiative that encourages patients to open a dialogue with their doctors and loved ones to communicate what matters most to them at the end of life. This means creating guidelines for your care, but it also means expressing your feelings to family and friends. Again, it's kind of a dark subject and one that most of us don't exactly embrace. The idea that you can leave this world without closure, however, is an even more unpleasant thought. The Project website includes three templates that you can use: O That matters more letter: This is a letter template that allows anyone to document what matters most to them and what treatments they want in the future. This tool is free and available in print, as an online fill form and as an application for iPhone and Android in eight different languages. Letter Project Advancement Directive: This tool allows anyone to answer a few simple questions in English. When they finish and click print, the tool will send them a valid advance directive document automatically filled out and an additional letter to their doctor describing their preferences for end-of-life medical care. This tool is free and available in print, as an online fill out form and as an app for iPhone and Android.Friends and Family Charter: This letter can help all adults complete their seven life review tasks: recognize important people in our lives; remembering precious moments in our lives; apologizing to those who may have hurt; forgive those who have hurt us; and saying thank you, I love you and goodbye. Using this template, you can write a letter to your friends and family in one of eight languages using an online form, an iPhone or Android app, or a printable form. Writing can also help you organize and present your thoughts without distractions, lip blocking nerves, an overload of emotion or disruption from your family members. These suggestions can help you write an outbound letter to family or friends. Don't be short on words. A letter is a great way to clear emotions and express your feelings at the same time. Let your thoughts flow freely. Try to write freestyle, where you write non-stop for a certain period of time. So reorganize your thoughts to make them more coherent. Forget the rules. Your output letter is not a paper term, and there is no standard format to follow. Organize your thoughts without thinking about spelling, grammar, or structure. Write about the past, present and future. In your letter, express how being in the closet made you feel and what it means for you to leave. Talk about your vision for the future and how important it is to have their support. Don't make assumptions. You know your family better and can anticipate a certain reaction, but they may surprise you. Keep in mind that each member of your family can process the information differently. So in your letter, make sure you express yourself without attacking. Dispel myths. Your letter is a great place to educate your family and friends. Clean up any myths, stereotypes or misconceptions you may have about LGBTQ people. Follow. Writing a letter is a very personal way of communicating. However, you should follow up and have a face-to-face discussion with your relatives. Reinforce your thoughts. During your face-to-face time, reiterate the thoughts and feelings expressed in your letter. Make a bullet version of your card and hold it in your hand. What you will do:• Print the model and paint it directly, or use it as a guide to mark lines on a larger sheet of paper or canvas. • Decide which colors you will use for numbers 1 to 3. Tips:• For perfectly straight lines, use adhesive tape to ensure that the paint does not go down where it is not desired. • Instead of painting on the black stripes, buy black tape and put it in place. Be sure to buy it at the right width as it is difficult to cut a length of tape in half evenly. When children study grammar, one of the most basic lessons they learn involves the parts of speech. The term refers to the category to which words are assigned based on how they work in a sentence. Knowing and understanding the parts of speech help children avoid grammar mistakes and write more effectively. English grammar is composed of eight basic parts of the speech: Nouns: Name a person, place, thing or idea. Some examples are dog, cat, table, playground and freedom. Pronouns: Take the place of a noun. You can use her in place of a girl or him instead of Billy. Verbs: Show action or a state of being. Verbs include the words run, look, sit, am and is. Adjectives give details such as color, size, or shape. Adverbs: Describe or modify a verb, adjective, or other adverb. These words usually end in -ly, as quickly, silently and smoothly. Prepositions: Phrases called prepositional phrases begin that describe the relationship between other words in the sentence. Words such as by, to, and between are prepositions. Examples of its use in one sentence include: The girl sat by the lake. The boy was among his parents. Conjunctions: Join two words or clauses. The most common conjunctions are and, but and or. Interjections: Show strong feeling. They are often followed by an exclamation point, like Oh! or Hey! Try some fun activities with your kids to help them learn how to identify each part of the speech: An activity could be to use a different colored pencil for each speech and underlining them in old magazines or newspapers.
