In fact, you can even buy faucets that install completely from the top of the sink, so you don't have to crawl underneath. But there are still things you need to know for a quick, easy and non-leak setup. Here are our best tips to help you with your next faucet setup. 1/10 The HandymanEven family with wrench pool, it can be almost impossible to break out the corrosion of nuts carrying old faucets to the sink. If you don't care about the wrecking faucet, cut off the nuts instead. You can use either a rotary tool (Dremel is one brand) with a metal-cutting disc or a oscillating tool with a metal cutting blade. Cut one side of the nut. Then use a screwdriver to snatch the nut from the body tap. You can also cut off other stubborn parts like pop-up build drain on the bathroom sink. 2/10 The HandymanA Family Wrench Key Pool is the standard plumbing tool that is needed to remove and install most faucets. The wrench allows you to reach in a cramped area behind the sink to loosen or tighten the nuts that hold the faucet to the sink, and the nuts that connect the supply lines. You may not need a wrench pool if you can get an old faucet by cutting nuts or if the new faucet includes a wrench or some other means of installing a faucet without a wrench pool. Check the inside of the package when you buy the faucet to see what is required. If you need a wrench pool, you can find one in a hardware store or a home center. 3/10 The Handyman familyIf the water gets under the faucet, it can corrmeele the faucet or worse, damage the countertop or cupboard. Most new faucets include a pad of some type to create a seal between the faucet and the sink, but it's still a good idea to apply a ball of clear silicone seal to the bottom of the faucet and the bottom of the pad to provide a good seal. In addition, silicone acts as a glue to prevent the faucet from moving if the compound nuts loosen. Clean any silicone that oozes, first using only a paper towel and then mineral alcohols. 4/10 The HandymanOne family of the most sophisticated parts of installing a new faucet is used to connect supply lines so they don't leak. But new style connectors with wicker jackets have pads built in at each end that make the connections virtually reliable. They are more expensive than the old-style connectors, but cost every penny. You don't need to crank the nut very tight for effective sealing. Just thread it toe-hard and then add about half a turn with a wrench. So save yourself headaches and replace these supply lines with wicker stainless steel connectors. 5/10 The HandymanMany family's new faucets include supply lines, but they may not be long enough, or they may not have the right theme themes to your valves turned off. To determine the length of the power lines you need, measure with the bottom of the sink nearby where the faucet connects to the valve shut down and add a few inches. If the supply lines are included with your new faucet not long enough, buy extensions. To make sure the streams on the new power lines match those on your valves off, take one of your old power lines with you to the store and compare it to the new power lines. 6/10 Family HandymanIf your valve is shut down stuck open, you can often release it by loosening the nut pack a bit. This relieves the pressure on the stem valve and allows the valve to turn easier. The Retighten stem nut valve is enough to prevent leaks around the stem valve. 7/10 The HandymanMessing family around with plumbing often displaces minerals or other debris that is created inside pipes and valves. To prevent that material from clogging the aerator in the new faucet, remove the aerator before turning the water back on. The aerator is a device at the end of the faucet that has a screen or perforated plastic end coating. Most aerators simply unscrew counterclockwise. Some new faucets include a special tool to remove the aerator. If you install a retractable faucet, the aerator can be difficult to remove. If so, simply unscrew the entire head spray from the power tube and point the tube into the sink until you turn on the water. Let the water run for a few seconds. Then replace the aerator or spray the head. If your faucet ever starts to run slowly, remove the aerator and clean it. This tends to fix the problem. 8/10 The HandymanMany family's new faucets include wrenches, aerator removal tools, and other parts or tools that you should keep. An easy way to track this stuff, along with a instruction sheet, is to put it all in a large freezer bag and hang it inside the sink cupboard where you can always find it. 9/10 The Handyman familyif you install a new sink along with the faucet, mount the faucet to the sink before you install the sink. It's much easier than lying on your back inside a sink cupboard to install a faucet. Even if you don't install a new sink, you may find it easier to remove the old sink to get better access to remove the old faucet and install a new one. In addition, removing and reinstalling the old sink will allow you to clean the old plug and shotgun that has accumulated along the edge and upgrade the seal between the counter and the sink with a fresh plug. 10/10 The Handyman familyWhen you're done with a faucet setup, check for leaks. Turn on the water and let it run for two or three minutes. Then crawl under the sink with some tissue and wipe around the joints with it. Even a tiny leak would like a wet spot on the fabric. Tighten the connection next to any leak you find. Photo: DeltaEven using a nifty tool called a wrench pool that extends your reach, it's still an awkward task to install a faucet on some kitchen sinks because it's hard to work behind a sink bowl from the cupboard below. The pool wrench reaches behind the sink to facilitate the installation of the faucet. Removing the sink at first may be an easier option, depending on the type of sink, although this is rarely the case. After installing the new faucet as described below, remove the aerator from the faucet and rinse the line to make sure that any debris does not clog and reduce the flow of water. On a standard faucet, simply unscrew the aerator at the end of the faucet and let the water run for a minute or two. With a retractable sprayer faucet, the aerator/filter is placed in the entrance to the head sprayer. Just don't read the hose, remove the aerator/filter and rinse. How to install a kitchen faucet: Step by stepMany new faucets require some assembly before mounting to the sink; If this is the case, follow the manufacturer's instructions.1 With most retractable sprayer faucets, the sprayer should be threaded through the body tap first.1. Assemble the body.2 crane insert a rubber pad between the base tap plate and the top sink to create a waterproof seal. If the pad is not provided, pack the faucet cavity with the plumbing putt and then insert the body faucet through the holes in the top sink. Thread the mounting nuts provided on the faucet shafts, then center the threaded shafts into the sink holes and tighten the nuts firmly. Thread the faucet through the holes in the sink.3 Set the mounting nut. Many manufacturers include a special long outlet specifically to help in tightening the egg mounting. The hole in the socket takes the tail of the screwdriver, directing it as you tighten the nuts. If you're installing a faucet on a installed sink, use this method. Tighten the mounting nut from the bottom.4 If you install a retractable sprayer faucet or faucet with a separate sprayer- now is the time to connect the sprayer to the body faucet. Check the manufacturer's directions to see if the use of pipe printing tape for this connection is recommended. Use an adjustable key to tighten the connection.4 Attach any secondary sprayers or devices.5 Add a counterweight. Most retractable sprayer faucets and faucets with individual sprayers come with a counterweight that attaches to the sprayer hose. This weight helps to drag the hose back into the sink cupboard after you have used the sprayer. Follow the manufacturer's instructions on where Weight, and take care not to cuddle the hose as you attach the weight. Protect the sprayer sprayer Connect hot and cold tap power lines to the water-disconnected valves under the sink. If necessary, gently bend the copper tubes coming out of the faucet for better access and connect the flexible power pipes to them. Simply wrap a couple of turns of pipe-printed tape around the threaded nipples on the valves and connect the tubes. Tighten the nuts with an adjustable wrench.6. Connect hot and cold supply lines. Choosing a new kitchen faucet may be easier than you think once you consider three important details before you start shopping. There are many different kitchen faucet and sink designs available, but they are not always compatible. Start by taking a look at the kitchen sink to determine how many pre-drilled faucet mounting holes are available. This applies if you install a new faucet in an existing sink or buy a brand new faucet and sink. If an existing faucet has a mounting plate on it, check under the sink to see how many holes the mounting plate covers. Keep in mind the following about mounting holes: Kitchen faucets can have one to four mounting holes. Three holes are used for spouts and two handles. The fourth hole is usually used for an accessory, such as a soap dispenser or side spray. Each new faucet indicates on the packaging how many mounting holes it needs to install. If you install a single handle faucet into a sink with three holes, the deck plate will usually cover up the unused holes. The location of sink mounting holes is another thing to keep in mind. Often the faucet is located near the center of the sink, but this is not always the case. If the faucet is installed on one side of the sink, the spout should be long enough to reach the opposite pool in order to be used. A high spout with retractable nozzle spray is another option for sinking with angular mounting holes. There are top mounting and lower fastening faucets. The top cranes are attached from under the counter. The screws are attached through the bottom of the crane. The lower fastening faucets are attached from the top of the counter. The screws are installed through the top of the crane piece. Make sure the new kitchen faucet you want is compatible with water lines. Look under the sink to the bottom of the cupboard and pay attention to the size of the existing water line and blackout valves. Here are some guidelines to use when checking your water lines and valve: If you're not sure what size your lines measure them with a measuring tape. While you may have to hunt for it, the size should be engraved on the valve. Note that the home may not have the valve turned off. Many new faucets come with 3/8-inch flexible lines attached. If the existing valves turn off the water 1/2-inch size, you will need to change the valves to 3/8-inch valves before installing a new faucet. It is usually a good idea to replace the shutdown valves when installing a new faucet, anyway, since the old valve can fail if you need to turn off the water for leaks or other repairs. If the sink mounting faucet holes are located closer to one side of the sink, make sure your spout is long enough to swing and reach the opposite side of the pool, especially if you have a double sink. One solution is to buy a high spout with retractable nozzle spray. This design is ideal for the design of the sink with angular mounting holes. Even something as seemingly small as finishing plumbing can make or break the aesthetics of your kitchen. There are a few rules. The kitchen faucet should match the trim of other sink accessories, such as a tiny air gap dishwasher, a built-in soap dispenser, and sink hole covers for unused holes. A mixer that has a shiny chrome finish will look out of place if the rest of the fixtures have a matte nickel brush finish, for example.
