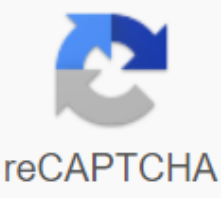

Out-of-state student teaching arrangements in online programs: Some schools maintain teaching agreements that lower the lessons for eligible non-state students. Recurring technology costs: Many online programs charge students remotely a technology fee per term or per class. Regional and national accreditation schools can be accredited at regional or national level. Regional accreditation is more common and respected than national accreditation. Students attending schools without regional accreditation may not be eligible for federal financial aid and generally cannot transfer credits to regionally accredited institutions.
