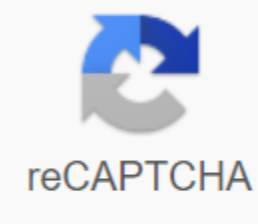




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## L leo judice elementary

Leo Judice's environmental programme raises students' awareness of the environmental needs of our community, promotes guidance among students and provides opportunities for meaningful links between learning and the environment. Key Components:Class Level Theme Gardens: Each class level plans and keeps the theme garden to connect to your curriculum. Topics include storybook gardens, Growing Vegetable Soup, Planting Rainbows, and Tops & Bottoms, Pizza Garden, Le Jardin du Traiteur, Sundial Garden, Cloth & Dye Garden, Charlie's Library Garden, and History Gardens-New World/Old World Garden and Colonial Herb Garden.Recycling program - Students learn stewardship through school recycling programs. Ink cartridges are recycled throughout the school year to raise money for technology and supplies for the school. Phone bookies are recycled in January and February, and the school's paper recycling programme teaches pupils about the importance of recycled paper and saving trees. Classroom Pets - Everyone knows and loves our school reading motivator and library pet, Charlie. Besides Charlie, all the classrooms have pets. Students learn responsibility when taking on roles to care for pets and feed them. Pets include aubergine, fish, hamsters, geckins, rats, turtles, turtles and bearded dragon. Project Learning Tree Certified School – More than 75% of L. Leo Judice's staff were trained in project learning tree curriculum, the foundation for environmental education. Teachers include the activities of the curriculum project in all areas of the curriculum. LSU Coastal Roots Program – With this program fifth grade students and teachers perform a pathway nursery program to grow native plant preria. Plants are used to restore coastal-slaied habitat. The program includes students with information on environmental issues such as ecological guidance, restoration and habitat conservation, while also teaching basic horticultural concepts and skills.4-H Seme for the Service School Garden Program – L. Leo Judice partners with the LSU AgCenter 4-H youth development program and the Master Gardener program to bring the subject to life through the school gardens. Students have their Google login information on the label within their agenda books.www1.lpsonline.com/site4214.php Click on the left - LOGIN WITH GOOGLE Step 2: Click on the Classroom and open the Classroom Library for your classroom level. Click on the Library's application form for the book. It will open and is ready for use. Step 3: Go back to the Smart tab and open LLJES DESTINY (this is the library catalog). Click on the CATALOG tab and search for our catalog. Select books in your child's AR level. Every 2nd-5th grade pupil has a label within the agenda with its reading range. Step 4: Copy and paste the book, author, and dialing number you want to request. You can also write this information down and enter it in the library book request form. Fill out the entire form and press SUBMIT. Complete the form for each address required. If the book is unreachable, I'll make a HOLD for them. Books are filled every morning. If the request is submitted after 11:00, I will fill it up the next day of school. All library books are quarantined after return. Students from the 3rd-5th grade studied and practiced how to request books when they came to the library for class. These students use their kromebooks during the library. Students in grade 2 don't bring their devices to the library, but I show you how to search for a catalog and fill out a form. Their teachers helped them. All students of K-5. They will attend the day-to-day start tomorrow. The car rider is gone and the pickup has been good in the last few days.
