BYU is urging students to consider leaving campus and returning home to complete summer deadlines through distance courses. We recognize that individual circumstances may prevent this. Services and housing on campus will continue to be available to those who choose to stay. Starting Friday, August 7, students, staff and campus visitors are required to wear face masks as outlined below. In all cool settings. Inside all university buildings. In open areas of campus, when physical distancing is difficult to maintain. In other areas, rooms or outdoors where required or directed. for the face should cover both the nose and mouth. Plastic face shields do not correspond to this Face masks in academic laboratories can be found here. Face masks are not expected to be worn by the following persons or in the following circumstances: a child under three; or who is three years or older if the parent, guardian or person with a disability who prevents the wearing of a face mask. Qualifying disabilities can include extreme claustrophobia, difficulty breathing or deaf or heavy hearing. Students are required to provide documentation of the conditions of the Faculty of Relations or Human Resources. If using a face mask is not recommended, people should maintain a proper physical distance of 6 feet or more at all times and follow all disease prevention quidelines. The person maintains physical distance during sports in the recreational or fitness center. A person traveling alone, or with members of their household, in a vehicle. A person is engaged in learning that requires students to see facial expressions or mouth movement. In such situations, the instructor must wear a face shield and maintain physical distance. The face mask should be replaced immediately after completion of the training. During active eating or drinking in a stationary place while maintaining physical distance between households. In private living guarters. Only one person is employed in enclosed office space. The employee sits in a designated office cabin that has three walls that are at least as high as a sitting person's head and physical distance is maintained. If not specifically instructed, individuals are not required to wear face masks in open areas if physical distance is maintained. Students, staff and visitors should bring in and then continue to provide their own face masks. The Centers for Disease Control has published instructions for making its own face mask fabric. Managers can order through risk management and face safety for employees who are unable to provide their own. BYU encourages students and staff to follow facial mask guidelines, as outlined in the Utah Health Regulations, when they are not on campus. Summer courses will follow normal gradation procedures. The skipping/recall option was only offered for the 2020 winter semester. Individuals must follow the instructions to isolate, comply with guarantine, or practice physical distance provided to them from the Utah County Health Department, health care providers, or BYU. Isolation is necessary for those who have had COVID-19. In addition, persons who and in anticipation of the test result should self-isolate. As a general guide, individuals who know they have had COVID-19 or had symptoms and think they have COVID-19 should be aware of the CDC's recommendations to stop isolation. Quarantine for those who have had direct close contact with the confirmed case. Direct close contact means staying within 6 feet of an infected person for at least 15 minutes, starting two days before the onset of the disease (or, for asymptomatic patients, two days before the samples are collected) until the patient is isolated. During quarantine, individuals in quarantine should stay at home and monitor the symptoms for 14 days from the date of their last exposure. Physical distance is a practice for all to follow. Health Officials recommend staying at least 2 feet tall, among others. Criteria for returning to campus: Individuals can withdraw from isolation or quarantine according to the above instructions and those they receive from the Utah County Health Department. BYI is working closely with the Utah County Health Department and can help as needed. Your professors will contact you about how your courses and exams will continue. Try to be patient when they work out the details. Plan to make your normal class time available until you hear otherwise. Many classes will take place through Zoom. Find a good place with a solid internet connection. If you don't have access to your computer or smartphone to receive video, you can use computers in the library, or the OIT has a limited number of computers available for checkout. Call 801.422.4000 to book and pick up a computer. More resources on learnanywhere byu.edu. All training programs abroad and performing tours scheduled for the summer term are canceled. BYU student tenants and BYU landlords can begin the process of resolving COVID-19 housing disputes by requesting mediation. Because of the BYU student Landlord agreement, students who are not BYU student students may require mediation with BYU landlords, but all participation is voluntary. Students who are not BYU students can use the formal legal system to address COVID-19 housing issues if the other party refuses to mediate. ByBl's landlord students lease agreement for 2019-2020. All cases of COVID-19 infection will begin in a teleconference mediation session via Zoom with a trained neutral third-party intermediary, applicant (tenant student or landlord) as well as a defendant (landlord or tenant student). Intermediaries act not as judges, but rather advocates of the process who help guide the parties through healthy coordination of issues. Each mediation session will last no more than 90 If the parties do not reach a resolution during the mediation session, either party may request arbitration. The Centre for Peace and Conflict Resolution will use well-trained third-party arbitrators from the legal community to individual cases. Control units will determine whether employees can work from home or are required to stay on campus. Under government guidelines, BYI is encouraged to work from home whenever possible. Departments should minimize face-to-face interaction and minimize meetings personally. Human resources provided more information about working from home. During the summer term, BYI employees whose work requires them to be on campus are encouraged to wear tissue face coverings in these circumstances: When physical distancing is difficult to maintain in enclosed public places in BYI While interacting with customers In other areas where required or directed by management Employees should specifically independently assess the presence of signs of fever, cough or difficulty breathing. BYE employees are strongly encouraged to use the Healthy Together app to assist with this. Employees who are symptomatic should be seen by a healthcare professional. Employees who test positive for COVID-19 should immediately report the test result to the university using this form. Managers and managers should also direct employees to return home if they are observed with any of these symptoms while at work. Managers can contact BYU's Compensation Department for guidance on employees who do not have sick leave as an option. BYU employees in high-risk categories including older adults and those with immunity - must continue to follow high-risk protocols established by Utah and BYU health officials. This includes working from home and exercising all possible caution. Individuals who work or live with individuals with high-risk categories should also continue to follow high-risk quidance. Questions about these circumstances may be addressed to human resources. BYI continues to restrict all business travel until further notice. Individuals returning from personal travel from domestic or international high-risk zones are self-isolated for 14 days. In such situations, students, part-time and full-time employees are encouraged to work from home at this time. If work from home is not feasible, managers can contact BYU's Compensation Department for more information, Individuals tasked with medical professionals, or county or State Department of Health officials, isolate, guarantine or practice physical distance should do so. In addition, anyone experiencing symptoms consistent with COVID-19, or who has been in direct, close contact with the presumptive case of COVID-19, should practice physical or self-quarantine and call the Utah County Health Department at 801-851-4357 for further instructions. In such situations, a student, part-time or full-time employees can work from home. If you are working the house is not feasible, managers can contact BYE's compensation department for more information. Here are three tips for preventing uninvited quests: Create a specific meeting instead of using a personal meeting ID Require meeting password Use the waiting room so you can see who joined before starting The The and the Office of the Academic Vice President together define the default setting, you must have attendees sign in to the meeting using their BYI credentials. Learn how to change this setting for a specific meeting and what happens when a meeting attendee (or someone without netID) isn't authenticated. Other protective measures they have taken include turning off the default host/member video, disabling participants at login and only sharing the host screen. Each of these default settings can be changed by the meeting host. Thank you for the excellent work you do to serve our students. The OIT has created this useful summary of scale safety tips to keep things running smoothly. Zum appears to meet BYU's privacy standards, including FERPA and GDPR requirements: It's acceptable for students to see other students and share their personal information at a Zoom meeting. Students do not need to consent if the meeting is recorded unless the records are shared outside the classroom environment, faculty members must obtain student consent because these records are considered education records and FERPA rules for disclosure apply. GDPR: Zoom has an explicit consent mechanism for EU users. Existing or new users coming from IP addresses detected from the EU will be presented with a one-time privacy policy update. Recommendation: While Zoom displays notifications when recording a meeting, the meeting host should also inform attendees when the meeting begins. Zoom recordings for classroom participation when participation, or, if necessary, to document classroom participation when participation contributes to classroom participation, or, if necessary, by a student to complete an incomplete class. The faculty is encouraged to make a live course delivery at a time when the class was originally scheduled. The Center for Teaching and Learning has launched TeachAnywhere.BYU.edu to help the faculty make the transition to distance learning. The university also licensed Zoom, a leading video and audio conferencing platform. Specific training for this tool is available Go.BYU.edu/zoomtraining. Learn Anywhere uses the same template as Teach Anywhere, but the content has been tailored to students. This site will allow you to stay up to date with messages sent to students. The biggest problems of bandwidth are restrictions on connectivity to the student and faculty network or equipment connecting outside of BYU's infrastructure. To reduce the load, please advise students to turn off the camera and use an audio computer/device during class meetings. A phone or set of audio is not recommended because it relies on local phone operators. Many students feel socially and intellectually isolated. You may want to consider creating digital learning groups. CTL consultants are available to assist as needed. Their contact information is on the home page of teach anywhere website. CTL offers a customizable middle-class assessment tool that can be used to get student feedback on how remote instruction works for them. Using this tool and/or other ways to partner with students to study/study online will improve our outcomes. The Department for Education (RED) has issued quidance allowing higher education institutions to take appropriate steps to accommodate students whose activities affect COVID-19 and allow distance education programs instead of regular classroom learning. More information can be found in the Coronavirus-Related Research Interruption Guide (COVID-19) issued by the Office of Post-Administration Education ED. BYU continues to prohibit gatherings of any size to slow the spread of COVID-19. Health officials also recommend staving at least 2 feet apart from others.
