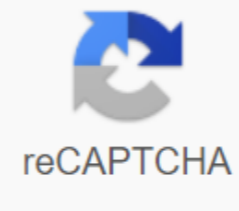

This school year is unique because our school offers both remote and mixed learning. Our school community has been working hard to set up a school program to provide the best possible education in the current circumstances. We thank our headteachers, management, staff and teachers for their immense efforts. The PTA meetings and the PTA election will be nearing. Queens College School of Mathematics, Science and Technology is a cheerful place that attracts students of different income levels and backgrounds from all of Queens. With only two classes per class, the school feels like a tightly knit community where teachers and staff catch all the students well. Although the trip may be long for some, the PS 499 is a good option for families who are willing to travel. As the name suggests, the school was founded with the support of Queens College and is in a spacious, modern building on the edge of the campus. Professors at the college are working with teachers to develop the learning plans, and the school benefits from a costly offer from student teachers. The vibe is welcome and creative. Children are calm and engaged in lessons, and teachers and staff seem to be pupils. For example, students who have a bad day can visit principal Simi Minhas for a few minutes of decompression and read a book, play a game on an iPad or keep the fish in a large tank that keeps him in the office. To reduce anxiety, a third-grade teacher allowed her students to use sticks and counters (called manipulatives) to solve problems both during class and during the Test, after all, there are only eight, she said. Teachers open their classrooms to children who need extra support or a quiet place at lunchtime. The school uses the Teacher Reading and Writing Project curriculum, which encourages pupils to read a wide range of books of choice and and revised several drafts of work on different topics. They read serial stories, mysteries and historical fiction, as well as biographies, memoirs and books on social issues and science. Teachers also associate readings with subjects that are studied in other subjects. For example, eighth-graders studying immigration in social studies read Emma Lazarus's new colossus in her English class as a guide to the debate about waves of immigrants before and after Ellis Island. In fifth grade, the grades are departments-- basically a modified high school format. Both teachers teach social studies, one specialises in English and the other specialises in mathematics. Students travel with their classes between the classrooms for instruction in these two subjects. The benefit is that students are ineded by a specialist in a classroom filled with resources to support this subject. Students change lessons for each subject starting in grade 6. There are three science teachers, each serving different classes of range: pre-k to 3, 4 to 6 and 7 to 8. Students from 6 to 8th grades have science every day. In other classes, students visit a science laboratory for instruction and complement their classroom teachers with projects and studies. For example, kindergartens walk around the campus to collect abyss and fallen foliage to learn about their different shapes, textures and colors. In science, they learn about deco degradation by delaying changes in leaves over time and crushing them hand-crushing them to mimic the process. Weekly enrichment classes include Latin dance, robotics, music, art and technology. Spanish shall be in classes 5 to 8. Children can participate in various activities by school, such as sport, art, debate, chess and dance. The PTA sponsors programs for elementary school and Queens Community Housing provides free activities for high school. Most students stay in eighth grade. Graduates go to schools such as specialist secondary schools, Francis Lewis, Townsend Harris, Queens School of Inquiry and Aviation High School. SPECIAL EDUCATION: There are no official ICT classes, but special education teachers are attending classrooms to support pupils with special needs, rather than being pulled out of class. PS/MS 499 also shares facilities with district 75 for students with severe disabilities. ADMISSION: The school accepts pupils after the lottery. Please contact the application school for an advance. For kindergarten, the school's purpose is to recognize the same number of students from each District of Queens. The school usually has a place in kindergarten for students who are neither the siblings of the current pupils nor continue with their fore-offs. For new pupils in grade 4, a few seats are usually open when class sizes are slightly larger. Sixth grade is the only entry point to high school; new pupils are not admitted to grade 7 or 8.
