Sociology also examines the relationship between man and the environment through ecology. The field of human ecology in sociology is focused on man and his environment. It therefore requires an understanding of the environment of which man is a part. Meaning and definition: The term environment is derived from the French word Environia means to surround. This refers to both the abiotic (physical or non-life) and the biotic (life) environment. The word environment means the surroundings where the organisms live. The environment and organisms are two dynamic and complex components of nature. The environment regulates organisms, including human life. People interact more strongly with the environment than other living beings. Normally, the environment means the materials and forces surrounding the living organism. The environment is the total amount of conditions that surround us at a certain point in time and space. It consists of interrelated systems of physical, biological and cultural elements, both individually and collectively. The environment is the sum of the conditions under which the organism must survive or maintain its life process. This affects the growth and development of living forms. In other words, the environment refers to the surrounding surroundings that surround living beings from all sides and affect their lives. It consists of the atmosphere, hydrosphere, lithosphere and biosphere. The main components are soil, water, air, organisms and solar energy.
