Is having a modest-sized spread of 10 dozen FB's to be DSD's instead of the average GHG/FA spread I have today to increase my odds significantly enough to justify the cost difference? It's hard for me to think this is going to happen. I'll probably never know. I don't feel comfortable spending that much on decoys, I would worry about the possibility of damage somehow in the field or in transport and I certainly don't want to get them dirty... This is America, if you have a coin and a desire to do it, I say do it. I'm not worried about that or let him keep me up at night when you get them, and l'm not going to. I'm going to look a little better and be happy just to have out and have fun with my buddies. They are a great looking decoy and I'm sure of very good quality. If the money wasn't an item, I'd buy an instit! Qac having a few houses or an office would be cool, and cheaper than a good mount. I wonder when the first decoy is simulated breathing and heartbeat... be sure approaching snow you can choose a lack of respiratory function right just before dealing with the circuit breaker with no feet. Almost all snow goose decoys on the market are cool or blue on the side of the color scale. Snow geese are actually on the warm side and have a more yellow tone. It was very important for us to nail and we used our house color spectrometer to do just that. We are confident that this alone will help stop more snow geese from killing the hole.
