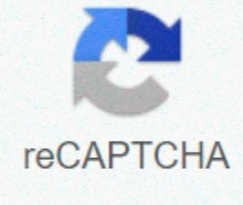

IELTS Speaking Test Information The following are the essential information about the IELTS conversation test. The conversation test is face-to-face with an examiner in a room. There's only one conversation test for all candidates. Academic & GT candidates take the same conversation test. If you're doing IELTS provided to your computer, you'll still have a face-to-face interview with the examiner. The conversation test remains the same for everyone. It has been recorded so that you can ask for an observation, if you wish later. This is an informal language test. The examiner who asks the questions will decide the results at the end of the test. The test lasts between 11 and 14 minutes (no more and not less). The examiner checks the time and duration of the answers. The test includes: ID control and Greeting Part 1 = questions and answers from 4 to 5 minutes Part 2 = a speech for 1-2 minutes with rounding questions for 1 minute.
