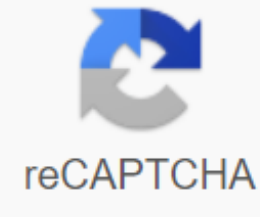

By Elyse Gibbons Get the phone number of someone or business in England, or the United Kingdom, can easily be if you have the right information and access to the internet. Similarly, if you want to draw a phone number in England, there are plenty of resources available for a small monthly fee. Finding a number in England has never been so simple. Make sure that you have the specific information required to do your search. The person's name or the business, even a place, will help. See someone or business' phone number in an online UK phone book, such as the BT Phone Directory. You can also try searching to scroll the UK electoral roll if the phone book search proves unsuccessful. The UK Electoral Roll is a paid service, but the fee allows access to contact information for all voters of the United Kingdom. To get the owner of a Metro phone number, visit a free online mobile phone directory, such as MobilePhoneNumber.com. It is an online directory and a section specifically for phone numbers that originally come from England. On the website, enter a phone number and the directory will release the information from its database. You can also sign up with a mobile phone company, such as TraceAMobile.com, which allows you to draw mobile phone numbers in the United Kingdom. This service has a monthly fee, however. A number of public folders are available online and you just have to find a way to get them for free. Finding someone's phone number for free is no longer difficult since there are many free phone reverse websites. As far as the records are concerned, you'll have to put in some effort to get them without a fee. Go to the website pip, and search for the person. This website claims to look at materials on the internet that usually don't show up in an ordinary search engine search (Google or Yahoo!). You just have to give the person's name and it will return the phone number as well as some public folders. Go to the Open Secret website and click Donor Lookup. Look for people with files you're looking for. The website has a database of more than millions of people. Another similar website is Tracking the Money but it specifically provides information about the state campaign contributions to individuals. Go to the Criminal Searches website. The website has compiled public records on criminal history from various jurisdictions across the country. View on the website of the Federal Bureau of Prisons. The website contains an Inmate Locator that lets you look up all of the people

who are currently in jail or have recently been released. See the person on an ordinary passenger's phone book to get his number. Websites like the WhitePages, Anytime or Reverse Phone Check let you find someone by name. However, the results will be limited to his phone number and address only. Reader David writes in with this excellent tip for phone anonymity: I need to call someone in my cell but I didn't want them to get my number of caller id. I know to use *67 at home when I want to do this but cell dealer is different – you don't get that double tone to let you know you are now restricting your number. With your cell, just start the number you are calling with the *67, as if the phone number starts with those three digits. The important thing to remember is that you will need to set the 1 in before the area code, as cells don't normally need 1. Normally, you get a phone number only when you pay for a landline phone service, when you activate a cell phone or SIM card, or when you sign up for a VoIP service. The number comes with the service. As of 2015, pre-1976 phone directories are mostly in copy paper, while those from 1976 to 1995 are all in microfilm. Phone books from 1996 to the present are considered current and available as copies of papers in the library pile. Except for phone books in the District of Columbia, Chicago and 14 states, microfilmed, all pre-1976 phone directories are available only as copies of papers, though the Library of Congress continues to convert all pre-1976 phone books to microfilm. Those 14 states include Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas and California; Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida and Georgia; and Hawaii, Iowa, Maryland and Pennsylvania. Readers ask the phone directory to complete a swipe call to the local History and Genealogy Reading Room. Write Phone Directory as the call number, city and state as the title and the year required as the volume number. View the microfilm directories by going to the Reading Room of LJ 139B and accessing the self-serving microfilm collection, which also hold microfilmed phone books from 1976 to 1995. Current phone directories include the years from 1996 to the present, and readers can find them on Deck 46 in the Primary Reading Room, where they are filled alphabetically by state. This location also houses many current foreign phone directories, which are arranged alphabetically by country. The study room reading area also has some current foreign directories. directories.
