However, the Oregon Republican Party voted to open the Republican primaries to nonpartisan voters for secretary of state, attorney general and treasurer. The Oregon primary election was held on May 17, 2016. Acting Gen. Jean Atkins (D) acting Jean Atkins (D) was appointed in March 2015 to replace Deputy Secretary Robert Taylor, who served on an interim basis after former Secretary of State Kate Brown (D) rose to governor on February 16, 2015. Atkins, former U.S. Sen. Jeff Merkley (D), was appointed to the post on March 6, 2015, and took office on March 11. After being appointed, Atkins said she would not seek election in 2016, leaving the election an open race. Party control in Oregon is traditionally a Democratic state, and in the 2016 election, Democrats had trifecta control of the state government. The last Republican to hold the governor's office was Victor Atiyeh, who served two terms from 1979 to 1987. Other state elected positions, including the state treasurer, secretary of state, attorney general and two U.S. Senate seats, have been held by Democrats for the past 15 years. The last Republican to win the state election was former U.S. Senator Gordon Smith, who lost his bid for re-election in 2008 to Jeff Merkley after two terms in office. The last Republican to hold the post of secretary of state in Oregon was Norma Paulus (R), who was elected in 1976 and re-elected in 1980. Paulus was replaced by Barbara Roberts (D), who later won the governorship. Before Roberts was elected No Democrat has held office since Steven Fowler Chadwick (D) left office in 1878. On the position of Secretary of State of Oregon is an elected constitutional official in the executive branch of the Oregon government and is the first in the governor's line of succession. The Secretary of State is the auditor of public accounts, the chief election officer and the administrator of public records. The responsibilities and qualifications of the Oregon Secretary of State are established in Article VI, Section 1 of the Oregon Constitution. Article VI, section 1: There are qualified state voters, during and in place of the choice of members of the Legislative Assembly, the Secretary and the Treasurer, who have held office several times over four years; but no person is entitled to participate in any of these offices over the age of eight for any period of twelve years. The responsibilities of Article 6, Section 2 of the State Constitution require that the Secretary of State maintain fair records of official acts by both the Legislature and the Executive Department of the State. The official duties of the office are outlined in Chapter 177 of the Oregon Charter: At 15 the official acts of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services are recorded and, if necessary, the same and all issues related to this before each branch of the legislature are kept. Attach the state seal to, and counter-sign all commissions and other official acts issued or committed by the governor, the approval of the governor's laws are excluded, and draw up a register of such commissions, specifying to whom given or granted, the office appropriated, with the date and tenor of the commission, in the book that will be provided for this purpose. Be charged with the possession of all registered laws and resolutions and not allow them to be removed from office or vetted, except in the presence of the Secretary of State, if by order of the Governor, or by the decision of one or both houses of the legislature, under \$100. Keep the office open during business hours during regular hours, on Sundays, except. No. qualifications for this post. Term limit in Oregon, the secretary of state is subject to term restriction. As stated in Article VI, No. 1 of the Oregon Constitution, an employee has the right to remain in office for eight years for a 12-year period.
