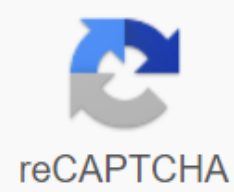

I found Take Command 10.0 after being frustrated with the poor command line in Windows. I found out it gave me what I wanted, and a lot of things I didn't know I wanted- but now I definitely do. Take Command is a great tool for anyone who regularly has to interact with the Windows command line (You know, that little window with C:\ reminder). It integrates its own console window (compatible with standard but supported command prompts) and a graphic file discoverer. Take the command also provides a basic development environment, including a debugger, for the batch type files you can create with it. It's not visual studio, but it doesn't need to be. For my purposes, being able to open multiple command shells in a card window, flip between them, and easily edit commands sent to spoken windows is more than enough, but the real heart of Take Command lies in its improvements to the weak Windows batch script language.
