Previews: About the Author Born and Raised in Paterson, N.J., by Vincent N. Parrillo experienced multiculturalism back in the son of a second generation Italian American father and an Irish/German American mother. He grew up in an ethnically diverse area, developing friendly and teenage romances with Dutch, German, Italian and Polish Americans of the second and third generation. As he got older, he developed other friendships that often crossed racial and religious boundaries. Professor Parrillo entered the field of sociology after first receiving a bachelor's degree in business management and a master's degree in English. After teaching English in high school and then as a college administrator, he took his first sociology course when he began his doctorate at Rutgers University. Inspired by a discipline that scientifically explores social issues, he changed his core and completed his degree in sociology. After leaving his administrative post but remaining at the University of William Paterson, Professor Parrillo has since taught sociology for more than 30 years. He has lectured throughout the United States, Canada and Europe and has regularly conducted diversity leadership programs for the military and large corporations. His keynote address at the bilingual conference of educators was published in Vital Speeches of the Day, which usually contains only speeches from national political leaders and heads of corporations and organizations. Professor Parrillo was a Fulbright scholar in the Czech Republic and a research fellow at the University of Pisa. He has been a keynote speaker at international conferences in Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Germany, Italy, Poland and Sweden. He met with government leaders, non-governmental leaders, law enforcement officials and educators in more than a dozen countries as a consultant on immigration policy, hate crimes and multicultural education. He gave an interview on Radio Free Europe and Voice of America, appeared on national Canadian television, and gave interviews to numerous Canadian and European journalists. Professor Parrillo's ventures in the American media include writing, narrating, and producing two PBS award-winning documentaries, Ellis Island: Gateway to America and Smokestacks and Steeples: Paterson. Contacted by reporters across the country for his views on race and ethnicity, he was quoted in dozens of newspapers, including the Chicago Sun-Times, the Cincinnati Enquirer, the Houston Chronicle, the Hartford Courant, the Omaha World-Herald, Orlando Orlando and Virginia Pilot. He has appeared on numerous U.S. radio and television programs. Professor Parrillo is also the author of Understanding Race and Ethnic Relations, the third edition (Alyn and Bacon), Modern Social Issues, the sixth edition (Alyn and Bacon), Cities and Urban Life, the fourth edition (with John Macionis), Diversity in America, the second edition, and the reinvention of today's minorities. His articles and book reviews have appeared in such journals as The Social Science Journal, Sociological Forum, Social Forces, Journal of Comparative Family Studies, Journal of American Ethnic History and Encyclopedia of American Immigration. He is the editor-in-chief of the Encyclopedia of Sociology for Sage Publishing. Some of his books and articles have been translated into other languages including Chinese, Czech, Danish, German, Italian, Japanese, Polish and Swedish. An active participant in various opportunities over the years in the American Sociological Association and the Eastern Sociological Society, Professor Parrillo has been listed in The Who's Who in International Education, Outstanding Teachers of America, American Men and Women of Science, and Who's Who in the East. In 2004, he received the Award for Excellence in Scholarships from William Paterson University. In March 2005, the Eastern Sociological Society named him his Distinguished Lecturer Robin M. Williams Jr. from 2005 to 2006 and elected him vice president from 2008 to 2009.
