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We're all familiar with maps. These are the papers that we pull out of the glove compartment - those crunchy documents that unfold so much that our view of the road is completely difficult. They make us wish we had go-go-gadget weapons that stretched to their width and two sets of eyes - one focused on the road and one on the built path. They make us wish that this woman's voice in the GPS system wouldn't lead us down a dead-end street. Different maps serve different purposes. If you are trying to drive from point A to point B and prefer a map by GPS instructions, the usual road map is the way. But if you've strayed from the road, perhaps on a mountaineering hike, you need to see the terrain and contours of the land. This means that you should be able to read topographical maps. Advertising What is the difference between a topographical card and a regular card? In a nutshell, topographical maps allow you to see a three-dimensional landscape on a two-dimensional surface.
