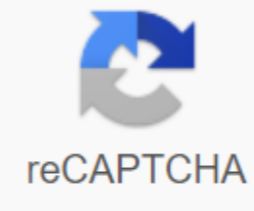

Great films explore everything from claustrophobic submarine warfare to expressionist visions of the future, from the angelic dreams of immortality to a certain mischievous dwarf. Lang, Wenders, Schlöndorff, Fassbinder, Herzog; here's our list of the top ten German films. Fritz Lang's expressionist 1925 sci-fi dystopia describes a world where a privileged few live to dance with a fawn while the masses work in gigantic underground factories - until a sexy robot upsets the system. Be sure to get a version without the Georgia Moroder soundtrack from the '80s. Every Film by Wim Wenders is worth watching, but his elliptical 1987 film (the original title translated means Heaven Over Berlin) wins such fine films as Alisa in cities and To the End of the World because it seems to sum up everything a filmmaker has to say about life and movies in one sumptuous, lyrical whole. With Bruno Ganz and Peter Falk directed by May Spils, Germany's response to France's New Wave is a dumber, more harmless version of Breathless. Werner Enke

plays a slacker who goes through the day in Munich and falls in love with Uschi Glas. The Oscar-winning adaptation of Volker Schlöndorff's novel about World War II Nobel laureate Günther Grass is an unprocessed film, as disturbing and surreal as German history itself. Rainer Werner Fassbinder, enfant terrible from the new German cinema, pays homage to Douglas Sirk's melodramas for 1970s Germany with this moving and incisive melodrama about the cleaner's love for a Moroccan immigrant. Barbara Sukowa stars in Margaret von Trotta's bracing biopic of the cult socialist revolutionary. A powerful, uncompromising film. Werner Herzog sent his best zloty Klaus Kinski to the South American jungle for this 1977 epic about a conquistador driven crazy by greed and ambition. The flame of Frank Potente's hair and Moritz Bleibtreu chase through Berlin in Tom Tykwer's riveting 1999 techno mindgame, the most impressive and stylish film to come out of Germany in years. The greatest submarine movie ever made, and one of the best world war II reality movies, Wolfgang Petersen's claustrophobic underwater epic is a tour de force. Leni Riefenstahl, otherwise known as Hitler's favorite filmmaker, deserves no sympathy for her Nazi propaganda, but deserves credit for her exceptional skill behind the camera. Her documentary about the 1938 Olympic Games is a beautiful film that celebrates the beauty of the moving body. By the way, her remarkable life is also the subject of a fascinating documentary. Between the two films you will see stunning chihuly glass sculptures in the lobby, the hotel's famous fountains and other landmarks. Millions of people flock there every year to get into water shows, botanical gardens, restaurants, nightclubs, gambling, and swimming pools. In real life, Stanley Kubrick shot famous snowy exterior shots at Timberline Lodge in Oregon. The film is considered by many to be one of the scariest films of all time. At the time, Timberline Lodge was worried that no guest would be willing to stay in room 217, which was portrayed as haunted in the book, so they asked Kubrick to change the room number in the film. A non-existent room was used instead, number 237. Ironically, 217 is the most hotel room. In addition to their connection to The Shining, guests love coming to Timberline Lodge to enjoy gourmet food and activities such as hiking, hiking and year-round skiing. Movie buffs will immediately recognize the Oak Alley Plantation in Vacherie, Louisiana, as Louis' plantation. Oak Alley Plantation Restaurant and Inn has a historical history even beyond its brush with a movie star.
