The book was published by Head Republic. She lectured on metaphysics, her books became world bestsellers. They were written in simple and humorous language that was put to millions of people. She moved away from academic style to teaching on life's examples. Her first book, Game of Life (and How to Play), was published by herself in 1925. Her next book: Your word is your wand, the secret door, the power of the spoken word. All texts by Florence Scovel Shinn lead women to success, using ancient knowledge. [3] She was educated in Philadelphia, where she met her future husband, the artist Everett Shinn (1876-1953). After the wedding, they moved to the studio apartment at 112 Waverly Place, near Washington Square, New York. Everett stood next to the theater, and wrote three plays in which Florence played the lead role. [4] Florence worked as an illustrator in the early 1900s. [5] She illustrated fiction in Harper's and other magazines, as well as popular novels such as Mrs Wiggs's Cabbage Patch (1901). [6] The Society of Illustrators elected her to associate membership in 1903, although she did not admit women to full membership of the organization until 1922. [7] Writings and New Thought Her metaphysical works began with her self-published The Game of Life and How to Play in 1925. Her philosophy focuses on the power of positive thinking and usually includes quidelines for verbal or physical affirmation.
