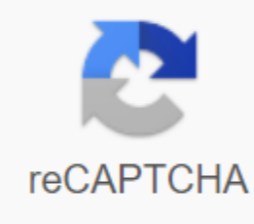

Home games are played on campus at PK Park. In 1877, he played the first baseball game and founded the program in 1885. The UO team made one College World Series appearance in 1954 and was eliminated from the tournament after losing to Arizona and Massachusetts. A decade later, after revamping the Western University Sports Association, Oregon was again the champions of the Northern Division, [4][6] but lost to the defending national champion in the USC district final (today's superregions). After the 1981 season, the university abandoned baseball and three other varsity sports (men's gymnastics, women's golf and women's football) due to

a budget crisis.[3][8][8] and baseball became a club sport in March 1983. [10] In July 2007, the university announced that it would again be waiting for the varsity baseball team starting with the 2009 season. One reason was the back-to-back National Championship by the Oregon State Beavers. [11] [12] [13] In-state rival Oregon State secured its second consecutive College World Series title a month earlier. In the Ducks' first game at PK Park, they defeated the defending national champions, the Fresno State Bulldogs, with a 1-0 walking single by senior Andrew Schmidt. A sell-out crowd of 2,777 was on hand for the game. [14] On 28 May 2019, George Horton and the Ducks agreed in part. On June 11, 2019, it was announced that Mark Wasikowski would take over as duck coach. From 2012 to 2016, he was previously an assistant at Oregon before taking up head coaching at Purdue. Stadium Ducks previously played baseball at Howe Field (44°02′28N 123°04′26W﻿ / ﻿44.041° N 123.074° W﻿ / 44.041; -123.074), south of McArthur Court, named in 1936 by Dr Herbert Crombie Howe (1872-1940), former Chairman of the Department of England. Howe began teaching at the UO in 1901 and was his original faculty representative at the Pacific Coast Conference in 1915, partly responsible for the league's founding. When the university fell for baseball after the 1981 season, he went to Howe during the 1981 season, The field was converted to use the Ducks women's softball team in 1987. [18] Softball was previously played in Amazon Park. [20] became a club sport in 1983 and Oregon was the only Pac-10 school without a varsity baseball program during 2008. After the return of baseball, announced in 2007,[11] the university built PK Park, just northeast of Autzen Stadium, previously paved parking lots. It opened for the Ducks in 2009, and since 2010 the park is also home to minor league Eugene Emeralds in the short season of the NorthWestern League,[2], whose season runs from mid-June to August.
