

The Hyannis Transit Center (HTC) is an inter-shipping hub in Hyannis, Massachusetts operated by the Cape Cod Regional Transportation Authority (CCRTA). It is also used by Plymouth and Brockton Street Railway and Peter Pan Bus Lines. The railway yard used by Cape Cod Central is located north of the station, along with a second house. The first Hyannis station was built by the Cape Cod Railway in 1854, it was replaced by an almost identical structure in the early 1900s. The station was also used by the Cape Cod and Hyannis Railways from 1984 to 1988, and the Amtrak Cape Codder Transport Center opened in 2002, with a double platform opposite the Cape Cod Central platform. c. The first Hyannis station was built in the late 1850s by the Cape Cod Railway in time for the arrival of the first train from Boston on July 8, 1854. Three trains a day to and from Boston, the tracks remain 1.6 miles (2.6 km) away. South to Hyannis Wharf, where the ferry connects Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket Island. Passenger services between Hyannis Wharf and Hyannis ended in July 1872 when the Woods Hole branch opened, although freight services continued until 1937. The old colony was leased by the New Haven Railway in 1893, the original repair shop at Hyannis was damaged by fire in 1857, burned again in 1898.[2] They were never rebuilt, but the replacement spherical house was built in 1901. In the first half of the 20th century, the station provided year-round service to Boston and seasonal services to New York City. On April 23, 2015, the company released a new In 1953, New Haven moved to a new station 1.0 miles (1.6 km) to the north, and the old station was demolished shortly after the last summer for New Haven's Cape Codder night service in 1958. The round house was sold to a moving company in 1954 and re-listed as a nightclub in 1980. Hilene proposed demolishing the building in 2019, but withdrew the application after pressure from historical and civic groups. [7] In July 1981, cape cod's central railway began offering summer excursions between Hyannis and sandwiches only. Part of an old gas station in Hyannis, built between 1900 and 1930 northeast of New Haven railway station, was converted to use as a station. The station was operated by the Cape Cod and Hyannis railways from 1984 to 1988 and Amtrak Cape Codder from 1986 to 1996. The large Hyannis Transport Center (HTC) was built to the north in 2002, with a platform on the opposite side of the same route. The seasonal CapeFLYER service, which began in 2013, uses HTC Cape Cod Central to continue using old stations, although HTC's accessible high-end platform is often used. The CCRTA Cape Cod Regional Transit Authority (RTA) bus connects the towns and villages of Cape Cod with one another, and with mainland Greyhound & Peter Pan Buses Greyhound and Peter Pan buses connecting Hyannis with Providence and New York City Plymouth & Brockton Buses Plymouth & Brockton buses connecting Hyannis to Plymouth MA and Boston Adventure Northeast buses in the summer, northeast transport services don't stop New York City buses from Maanais to Hyannis Adventure to the Ferry. Add Refill by CapeFLYER Train, launched in 2013, provides one train in each direction between South Station in Boston and Hyannis on Friday, Saturday and Sunday from Remembrance Day (late May) to Labor Day (early September). Train travel stops at Brentnort, Middleborough/Lakeville, Wareham village and Buzzard Bay take about 2-1/2 hours and cost \$22 per adult, one way, \$40 round trip. Children aged 12 and under ride for free with adults. Senior senior Charlie Gard pays half the fare Add more Amtrak train services to Providence, RI, connect peter pan buses to Hyannis, making this a great way to get to Cape Cod from New York City. Added, refilled by The Barnstable Municipal Airport of Plane Hyannis (HYA), is the busiest airport in Cape Cod, with regular flights to Boston Nantucket and Martha's Vineyard and connecting flights through Boston. The airport is located north of Hyannis at the traffic intersection (rotary) of MA 28 & amp; 132, 6/10 miles (1km) NW of Hyannis Transport Center, just 200 meters/meter away from the city center (map), several companies along here are chartered small planes. Martha's Vineyard and at the foot of Pleasant Street for passengers and ferries operated by steamer agency (call 508-477-8600), the shuttle bus connects the Hyannis Transport Center to the ferry terminal, but you can walk there in about 15 minutes if your luggage is not heavy —by Tom Brosnahan Banahan.
