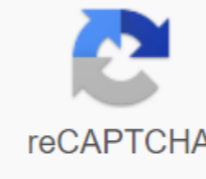

The 1996-97 MeJHL season is the sixth season of the Metro Junior A Hockey League (MeJHL). The 16 teams from the Central, Eastern and Western Divisions competed in a schedule of 50 matches. The top 12 teams made the playoffs. MeJHL's playoff winner, the Aurora Tigers, failed to make the national playoffs because Metro was not a member of the Ontario Hockey Association. On February 21, 1997, Ryan Venturilli of the Muskoka Bears became the first known goalkeeper in hockey history to score two goals (both clean empty) in a hockey game against the Durham Huskies during the 1996-97 Metro Junior A Hockey League regular season. [1] It changes the league from 2 divisions to 3, adding central division. Durham Huskies, Quinte Hawks, Syracuse Jr. Crunch and Port Hope Buzzards join MeJHL. Näytä kaikki The Junior Gold High School League has two \$1,500 scholarships available to graduate seniors properly in a junior gold team. These two scholarships are named after Wes Barrette and Bruce Kruger; two of the founding fathers of Junior Gold High School Hockey in Minnesota. Wes Barrette: The Herb Brook Foundation established the Youth Hockey Hall of Fame award in 2005. The aim of the award is to recognize the unsung heroes of youth hockey who give their time and energy year after year to create more positive opportunities for our young people. The inaugural Herb Brooks Foundation (HBF) Inductee Hall of Fame is Wes Barrette. As a junior coach on the East Side of St. Paul, Minn., Wes Barrette taught ice hockey for 45 years while instilling valuable life lessons to generations of players, who are now affectionately known as Wessy's Boys. Barrett died in 1998 at the age of 70. Barrette tried to provide additional game opportunities. His junior gold dwarf the teams were made up largely of those cut from the lists of high school teams. Some players voluntarily spent a season or two of high school hockey just to get a chance to play for him. Over the years, Barrette recorded more than 600 victories and his positions achieved success at the university, professional and Olympic level. Barrette started Hayden Prosperity, the first hockey team east of Lake Phalen in St. Paul in 1953. In 1984, Barrette was instrumental in the creation of the Metro Hockey League, now known as the Junior Gold High School League. The Wes Barrette Award was later established by this board of directors in 1997 and is awarded annually to the league coach of the year. In recognition of his enduring contributions to the sport of ice hockey, Barrette twice received the President's Award from MAHA Minnesota Hockey. Us hockey also awarded the William Thayer Tutt Prize to Wes Barrette in 1999. Bruce Kruger Bruce Kruger was a longtime Junior Gold High School League, Metro Hockey League, and member of the Minnesota hockey board and one of the leading advocates of junior hockey. Known for his firm but fair and kind, Bruce had a vibrant passion for hockey and connection with people who nurtured more than 45 years of service as a youth hockey volunteer. Bruce received the prestigious Don Clark Award in 2018 , presented by Minnesota Hockey to an individual who over a period of many years has dedicated himself to grassroots growth and the development of youth hockey in In 2006, the Metro Hockey League, now known as the Junior Gold High School League, began the Made it Happen award to recognize the enormous contributions of people who are not coaches, such as district managers or individual association Jr. Gold Directors and/or tournament directors. These are the local people who work tirelessly behind the scenes to organize, recruit, expand, register and even nurse teams from their associations to grow all levels of junior gold hockey in Minnesota. In 2017, the Hockey League of the Metro-Junior Golden School renamed this award the Bruce Kruger Award after Bruce's untimely death in 2016. Bruce was the founding father of the Metro Hockey Junior Gold High School League and remained active as its treasurer along with countless other things he did to improve this league before it happened. His dedication, passion and selfless service embodies the very reason why this award was created. Also in 2017, The Metro - Junior Gold High School League added a second scholarship named after Bruce Kruger as part of minnesota's hockey scholarship program.
