The possessive adjective is used with a noun, the Pronoun of the Holder is used without a noun. The holder's pronoun replaces Holder Adjective + Noun: Examples: This laptop is my laptop, not my laptop. This laptop is his, not mine. These keys, not the keys. These keys are not yours, not yours. Are these your bikes? yes, they're ours. Is this your grandparents' house? That's not my sister's cat. Hers is much larger and has darker skin.
