Navy SEA Lions work in small units - often one or two men, but sometimes in a department made up to 16. They are trained to perform specific tasks in any kind of circumstances and in any environment. Their coaching takes place in the desert, in the jungle, in extreme hot and cold weather, and in urban surroundings. Navy SEAL missions require detailed planning and precise execution. Navy SEALes are trained to carry out missions that fall into five main categories: unconventional warfare (UW) - the use of guerrilla warfare tactics in combat. Guerrilla warfare is characterized by small, mobile fighting groups that often operate in unconventional combat methods such as destroying enemy supplies, creating distractions, ambushing small enemy units, demolitions and other types of hit-and-run operations. Internal Foreign Protection (FID) - Training given to foreigners in order to build relationships. During Operation Desert Storm, navy SEAS trained 13 Kuwaiti operators using naval infiltration techniques to set up a secret meeting with local resistance contacts inside the Iragi-occupied city of Kuwait. Direct Action (DA) - Moves against enemy target. This may include assaults on land or water targets, extracted hostages, ambushes etc. Counterterrorism (CT) - includes direct action against acts of terrorism, counter-terrorism operations to prevent acts of terrorism and the protection of civilians and soldiers. Special Reconnaissance (SR) - includes conducting preliminary surveys for information gathering, staffing observation posts and other types of surveillance, both generally and covertly, with the goal of gathering information. This may include collecting hydrographic data (coastal and water surveys) for landings or tracking an enemy unit and reporting its location. When sea lions are not deployed, they are constantly in training, both to hone basic skills and to learn new skills and techniques that will make a difference when deployed. The above categories overlap when it comes to actual tasks, but these are the basis for SEAL training; to be an expert in the Navy go eight weeks (plus a week just for processing and paperwork) of recruits at the Great Lakes Naval Training Center, on the shore of Lake Michigan near Chicago. The Navy's training camp is based more on classrooms than other military training and weapons exercises are conducted indoors. Among other things, this is because so many normal Navy activities occur inside ships. This puts each Navy recruit with more experienced sailors in a variety of rankings to learn different Navy missions firsthand. Navy miloimniks practice one weekend a month and two weeks each year. They provide a ready-made force of trained sailors who can be summoned if the Navy needs more manpower for a reason. Miloimniks are eligible for technical training during their service, and are eligible for certain veterans' benefits upon retirement. Life on the beach for navy personnel is exactly the same as it is at other military bases. Everyone receives a housing allowance (new recruits usually live in dormitory-style apartments), and base housing is available to individual sailors as well as larger families. Many facilities are included at the base, such as grocery stores, medical facilities, churches and libraries. Leisure options are also provided, such as cinemas, golf courses and fitness centres. The focus on Navy life, of course, is to live and work on a ship. The deployment of standard Navy ships will take six months; However, the Navy is conducting experiments with deployments and lots of patience and handles. Circumstances also require absolute and unwavering loyalty and obedience to the ship's captain, whose authority over his ship is absolute. There's a lot of work to be done at any given time on a Navy ship, so sailors are busy. Even so, limited recreational activities are provided — one famous example was the Reagan Idol singing competition held on the USS Ronald Reagan that landed the winner of the actual TV show American Idol in 2007.
