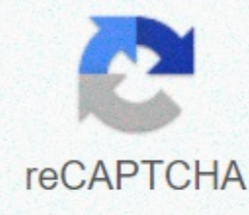

The season of collecting blueberries is 10 th at us. A bucket of blueberries filled all the way to the top is the goal for most blueberry collectors, and on Blackbirds Farm & Blueberries you'll find Gail Olson. It's important to choose blueberries, which is blue length, so the back should also be blue.' Olson said. They should also come off the stems very easily. You can tell Gayle has done it before. Just look at her hands. They're blue! She usually tries to pick about 35 pounds of blueberries each year. These blueberries are so delicious, they're the best I've ever had, Olson said. The farm has about 3,000 blueberry factories this year. Enough for you to do all the blueberries stuff. You can make blueberry cupcakes or you can put them in a smoothie or make blueberry pie, Olson said. There's no special technique when it comes to collecting blueberries, but keep that in mind. If they're not ripe, they won't roll back,' she said Blackbirds & Blueberries laurie Iton. You will tow them. Blackbirds & Blueberries Farm is about three acres in size and you'll find a variety of at least seven blueberries. It's four different fields really, and they're maturing at four different stages, Iton said. So it takes quite a lot of work to keep. We do a lot of tasting and we walk the fields constantly, Iton said. The blueberries harvesting season lasts about three weeks based on one major factor. I'd like to schedule it a little faster, but we can't it just depend on the weather, Iton said. Blueberry gatherers come at any age. The staff tell us the youngest picker they had was about two weeks old. We have older people who can't choose them anymore, and so we choose them, and we offer this service to just some people life getting in the way, Iton said. Blackbirds & Blueberries has updates on Facebook over picking up time, so grab a bucket. There is nothing better than fresh blueberries,' Eaton said. Strawberry season is over in all but distant northern and cool areas. Blueberries, blackberry blackberries in season in most areas, as well as tomatoes, peaches and most vegetables. Check your area's copy calendar (see this page) and call your local farms for seasonal updates. Now more than ever, going to the farm, being outside, away from the crowd, getting fresh, local produce, makes more sense than ever before! It's fun, safe and educational to pick fresh berries, fruits and vegas and more, then come back here to learn how to freeze, can, make jam, salsa and more!
