Oshkosh west high school shooting updates

Updated on: December 3, 2019/7:41 PM/CBS/AP A 16-year-old student stabbed a school resource employee Tuesday morning at a Wisconsin high school before the officer shot the student, police said. It was the second school shooting in the state in as many days. Both the student and the school resource officer were injured and transported to hospitals after the incident at Oshkosh West High School, Oshkosh Police said. Nor have they suffered what is expected to be a life-threatening injury. The school official alerted other officers in Oshkosh to an altercation with the student at 9:12 a.m., Superintendent Dean Smith said. He said the student was brandished a firearm and stabbed the officer in his office, Smith said. Smith wouldn't say the gun was a knife. The officer opened fire and once struck the student. Other officers arrived and began life-saving treatment for the officer and the student. Some students were evacuated from the school, while others were on site. The case has been turned over to state criminal investigators. One senior, identified only as Josh, told the Journal he heard gunshots. I was walking into the hall and a teacher pushed me into the classroom, and we started the door barricade, we all huddled in the corner and there were gunshots, he said. Officers responded after a school resource officer opened fire on a student who stabbed him at Oshkosh, Wisconsin high school on Tuesday CBS affiliate CBS-TV Reverend John Seelman, pastor of Emanuel Lutheran Church across the street from the school, saying he saw one person being transported from the school in a wheelchair, who was taken away in an ambulance, and who another was carried away on a stretcher. Stephanie Carlin, a sophomore mother and senior at Oshkosh West and a member of the school board, told the Associated Press that one of her sons texted her to say it was crazy, but both of her sons were safe. As a parent, it's terrifying, Carlin says. This is a parent's worst nightmare. The incident comes a day after an officer shot dead an armed student at another high school, about 80 miles south in Waukesha. The student was wounded in Monday's shooting at Waukesha South. Police said Tuesday that the 17-year-old student pointed a gun at another student during a fight between students on Monday. Police said Tuesday that a school resource officer and a detective began talking to the student after the fight. Police say the teenager had a gun in his hand when an officer shot him once in the leg and twice in the arm. Authorities immediately gave the student first aid, stopping the bleeding. The student is in a stable condition. Police found two guns in the classroom and said both had guns. Police later searched the student's home and found more guns. The incident happened shortly after 9 a.m. at the school resource officer's office at Oshkosh Western High School in Oshkosh, about 90 miles northwest of Milwaukee, police said. At 9:12 a.m., police received a message from the school's resources officer, who asked for help and an ambulance, according to the Oshkoshko police chief. The first officer in charge arrived in two minutes. The 16-year-old student stabbed the officer with a handgun before being shot by the officer with a 9mm pistol, Smith said. Both the student and the officer were treated in hospital for non-life-threatening injuries, Smith said. Smith said investigators were checking to see if there were any warnings about the incident on social media. We believe that only one suspect is involved ... and this incident was isolated for this meeting, he said. Earlier, police said in a Facebook post that an armed student was confronted by a school resource officer and both were injured and taken to local hospitals. The school was locked down and parents were instructed to reunite with their children at Perry Tipler Middle School, police said. Today's incident was a limited issue, said Vicki Cartwright, head of the school in the Oshkosh area. First of all, we are so grateful for the proactive safety measures that are in place throughout our area, as well as our partnership with local and state law enforcement authorities. Our students and staff followed our emergency protocols. She said classes would be cancelled on Wednesday and made available to councillors. There are about 1,700 students in high school. Today's tragic event shows that trained school resource officers can help save lives, Cartwright said. The state's investigative unit has taken over the investigation. That's what happened Monday in Waukesha on Monday in Waukesha, an officer shot and killed a 17-year-old high school student, police said. The suspect, who police pointed a gun at the officers, is in a stable condition in the intensive care unit of a local hospital, Waukesha Police Chief Said. He may face multiple felonies, but he has not been charged. No other injuries were reported. Waukesha police told reporters on Tuesday. Another weapon and drugs were found in the suspect's home in his bedroom, Baumann said. Bowman said the student was angry at another student and pointed one of the weapons at his head. The incident at Waukesha Southern High School unfolded after a student reported a classmate with a gun. That's when a school resource employee rushed into the classroom and began urging other students to protect themselves, police said in a press release. Other officers responded and tried to engage in dialogue with the suspect, Jack said. The suspect at one point pulled out the gun and pointed it at officers, Baumann said. Brady Esser, who rushed into the classroom, fired his weapon, hitting the suspect in the leg and arm, the captain said. Esser is an 11-year veteran. Bowman praised the way students, employees and employees responded. That's why we train, he said. That's why we continue to do what we do in training and preparation, unfortunately, for events like this. Jack added: SRO did a great job immediately responding to the information and being able to remove many students from the path of harm. While this was happening, another officer was forced to unload his firearm based on the imminent threat the suspect was subjected to. This is the chief's worst nightmare. A 15-year-old boy was arrested after police found him with a copy of a firearm at his home, according to a press release. Police were called to the northern high school about 1am. Monday about reports of a student with a gun, the release said. After the school was placed under lock and key, an investigation found that the student was no longer on the school property. After an investigation, we do not believe the students are in danger and that this comment should not have been a threat against Oshkosh Northern High School, police said. () The Germantown School District has learned of a potential threat to Germantown High School, the head of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the police chief said Tuesday. This potential threat was followed by a similar threat to Kennedy Middle School, German officials said. Police are investigating both reports and have been able to determine who it is to initiate threats, the statement said. School and law enforcement officials will meet with ... with the person responsible for initiating these scams and the parents of the individual, start the process of appropriately dealing with these fictional threats. Police said the potential threats were not credible, and classes were not interrupted at either of the two Schools in Germantown. • On November 26, Greenfield Public Schools were closed due to irresponsible comments about the potential school shooting at Greenfield High School, according to a joint statement from the school district and police. Greenfield police thoroughly checked the threat and found it was not credible, and the student admitted making false statements. SRO communicate with students, enforce the SRO laws is assigned to each of the two public high schools in the school district Oshkosh, according to the city's website. The main goal of the police officers, who are Oshkoshko police officers, is to prevent youth crime through education and positive communication with students. SDRs also respond to problems in their assigned schools and help with unusual events in primary schools, the website says. SDRs take part in appropriate class lessons on topics such as harassment, internet safety and laws involving dating and relationships. The National Association of School Resource Officers said there are between 14,000 and 20,000 SPs across the country. The association recommends that they receive at least 40 hours of specialized training in school police officers.
