I recently bought a Haitian curly tail lizard. After the first day, he buried himself in the sand and did not appear or eat for four days. He was checked by a vet before the sale. It seemed to have a very strong tail and hind legs and a round belly that could be fat stores for hibernation. Should I dig it up or leave it alone? Hopefully by the time you read this, your little curly tail will be checking out its new habitat. It's common for them to bury in the sand when they're scared or tired. Hopefully you have several hiding places in your cage, made of stones (which can not topple and crush a lizard), pieces of wood, plants or commercial hiding furniture. The temperature gradient should be from the 1970s to the 1970s. Once your curly tail becomes comfortable in its new environment, its will most likely come to explore its habitat if it is warm enough. They are also located near the beaches, where they prefer to bury themselves in the sand after sunset. Due to this habitat, they are prey to several birds and animals. Curling and wagging their tail is a method of distraction they use to escape. They were also known to play dead. Ideally, curly tails require an area with a large life of insects, which is needed in large quantities during the mating season. If you live in a coastal area, and want to attract these reptiles to your yard, all you have to do is build a pile of rocks, and if any curly tails are nearby, they are sure to come and look at it. However, be careful not to have any domestic cats in your area as they prevent curly lizers. Curly tails emerge during the day into the open space and the sun itself to kick-start its metabolism. They spend their day hunting insects and other smaller species of lizards. Males fiercely defend their territory from other males, while you could find two or more females together. Males intimidate each other by curling and wagging their tails while attracting females. Mating usually takes place in the spring. Females lay many batches of 3 - 4 eggs in a rocky shelter, and children hatch from eggs and appear sometime during June or July. Children will have a bright orange throat for the first few days after hatching. Conservation status and threats of curly-eyed lizards have the least-feared status according to the IUCN. However, predation by pets such as cats, dogs and rodents is a major threat. Also, the growing demand for curly tails as pets threatens the population. Urban development is less of a threat, as curly tails gradually adapt to their new urban environment. Curly-tailed Lizard Care Guidelines Curly tails are active, robust lizards that don't require much care. They have a life span of 5 - 7 years. However, to ensure that they live so long, there are several things that you need to take care of. Habitat requirementsA 20-gallon remote tank is ideal for one lizard with a curly tail. A deep layer of soil or sand should be available for the lizard to bury inside. The tank should have full spectral UV lights and adjustable temperature settings. Daytime temperatures should be between 80 -100 degrees Fahrenheit, while night temperatures should be up to 70-80 degrees. For this purpose, it is best to use a radiant heat source. You can have stones and branches in the tank for them to rely on. Also, give them some dark shelters. However, be careful not to escape. You can either use a safe lid for the tank or have a tank with high walls. You should regularly fog the tank with water using a spray bottle to maintain 60 -80% moisture in the tank. You must never have more than one man in the same tank because they will fight and kill each other. Instead, you can have a group of women or one man with women. You will need to clean the tank of all uneate food or feces once a day. The tank will have to be poached once a week. DietProcade a wide variety of live insects daily. You can use wax worms, crickets, cakes, etc. Occasionally, you can feed the fruits of green leafy vegetables and some fruits. There should be enough drinking water. It should be chlorine-free and must change every day, along with the removal of all uneate foods. You will also need to dust some calcium and vitamin supplements from time to time. Health problemsAs when curly tails are quite resistant to most diseases and pests, it is important to maintain good hygiene standards. A person must always wash his hands before and after handling this reptile to prevent salmonella and other infectious diseases. If the curly tail shows deformities or softened bones, it is probably a lack of calcium due to insufficient UVB lighting. Consult an exotic veterinarian and add additional UV lighting to the tank. If the tank is too cold or wet, it can cause breathing problems, indicated by heavy breathing and mucus around the mouth and nose. Increase the heating and immediately consult a veterinarian. Remember that if you see weight loss/low appetite, mucus, paralyzed body parts, lethargy, or any abnormal symptoms, visit an ASAP veterinarian. Breeding If you have a lizard with a curly tail and suitable humidity and temperature, there is a good chance that the lizards mate and the female lays eggs. Once you get the eggs, it is important to immediately pull them out of the tank and put them in a large cup filled with slightly damp vermiculity. This cup must be kept in the incubation area at a constant temperature of 80 - 85 degrees Fahrenheit. Also, do not turn the eggs on the side or upside down. This can cause children to suffocate inside the eggs. Make markers on eggs to prevent such an accident. HandlingBe be careful when lifting curly tails, because they tend to fight a lot and prefer to their from their owners. Lizards with a curly tail are lizards living on the ground and, like all lizards, are cold-blooded. They bask in the sun on the rocks during the day to absorb heat and stimulate their metabolism, and poke around at night to save heat. There are 28 species of Curly-Tailed Lizard, and they range from 4 to 14 inches in total length. They differ in color, from brown to green to gray, and will also have different characteristics. Adult Male Curly-Tailed Lizards Are Usually Larger Than Females. Some female species will display a wider range of colors, especially during pregnancy. In accordance with their name, lizards with a curly tail will twist their tails in different situations. The behavior of the curly tail is considered courtship in men to attract a partner, a depiction among men to mark or defend their territory, or a reaction to a threatening situation. It is believed that lizards with a curly tail can twist their tails in response to a threat to lure predators to the tail instead of to the head. Since the tail in most lizards can be separated and regrown, it is thought to be an adequate defensive response. They can also twist their tails simply when stationary or running. The diet of curly lizards is omnierous. They eat insects, small flowers, seeds, fruits and crustaceans. In some areas curly-tailed lizards are quite tame and will eat handouts from people. In addition, they were occasionally known to eat smaller lizards. Since the Curly-Tailed Lizard is very common throughout the Caribbean, most of the 28 species are relatively unexplored.
