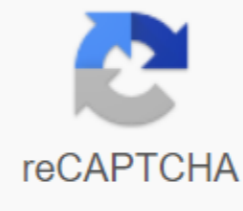

[1] Ingraham previously hosted the nationally syndicated radio show The Laura Ingraham Show for nearly two decades, is the editor-in-chief of LifeZette, which began in October 2017, hosts The Ingraham Angle on Fox News Channel. [2] Ingraham worked as a speechwriter in the Reagan administration in the late 1980s. She then obtained a J.D. degree and subsequently worked as a judicial clerk in the Second Circuit Court of Appeals in New York and subsequently for United States Supreme Court Judge Clarence Thomas. She also worked for law firm Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom in New York City. Ingraham started her media career in the mid-1990s. Early life and education Ingraham grew up in Glastonbury, Connecticut, where she was born to Anne Caroline (née Kozak) and James Frederick Ingraham III. Her maternal grandparents were Polish immigrants and her father was from Irish and English ancestors. [4] She graduated from Glastonbury High School in 1981. [quote required] In 1985, Ingraham granted a B.A. of Dartmouth College. In 1991, Ingraham earned a Juris Doctor at the University of Virginia School of Law. [5] Career Ingraham speaks at the 2016 Republican National Convention[6] Ingraham at a political conference in December 2018 Ingraham worked as a speechwriter in the Reagan Administration for the Domestic Policy Advisor in the late 1980s. She also served as editor of The Prospect, the magazine issued by Concerned Alumni of Princeton. After the right school, in 1991, she served as a law clerk for Judge Ralph K. Winter, Jr., of the U.S. Court of Appeal for the Second Circuit, in New York and subsequently clerked for U.S. Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas. She then worked as an attorney at the New York-based law firm Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom. [8] In 1995, she appeared on the cover of The New York Times Magazine in connection with a story about young conservatives. [9] In 1996, she and Jay P. Lefkowitz organized the first Dark Ages weekend in response to Renaissance weekend. [10] The television programme host Ingraham had three shifts as cable television host. In 1996 she became the first became a host on MSNBC. [11] In the late 1990s she became a CBS commentator and the MSNBC programme Watch It!. [12] Several Later, on her radio show, Ingraham began campaigning for another cable television show. She received her wish in 2008, when Fox News Channel gave her a three-week trial for a new show entitled Just In.[13][14] In October 2017, she hosted a new Fox News Channel show, The Ingraham Angle. [15] Radio show host Ingraham launched The Laura Ingraham Show in April 2001. [16] The show was heard at 306 stations and on XM Satellite Radio. It was originally synched by Westwood One, but moved to Talk Radio Network in 2004. [quote required] In 2012, Ingraham was named the No. 5 radio show in America by Talkers Magazine. [17] In November 2012, she announced her departure from Talk Radio Network and refused to renew her contract with TRN after being associated with the network for nearly a decade. She was the second major host of TRN's lineup to leave the network that year: TRN's other major program, The Savage Nation, had left TRN two months earlier. Her new program, syndicated by Courtside Entertainment Group, began airing on January 2, 2013 and went out of the sky in December 2018. [18] Ingraham continues to produce podcast material for Courtside's PodcastOne section. LifeZette LifeZette is a conservative American website founded in 2015 by Ingraham and businessman Peter Anthony. Ingraham confirmed in January 2018 that she sold the majority interest in LifeZette to The Katz Group, owned by Canadian billionaire Daryl Katz. [21] Political views and controversy in 2017, Ingraham was described by The New York Times as an ardent nationalist. [22] She is known for her strong support for Donald Trump. [22] In 2014, she was an angry critic of immigration reform and said in 2014 that more immigrant workers would come to the United States.[22][24] and in 2014, Ingraham said that more immigrant workers would come to the United States, would be obscene to the American experience. [24] She opposed the proposed bipartisan-2013 U.S. Senate comprehensive immigration reform plan. [25] Ingraham said her influences include Ronald Reagan, Robert Bork and Pat Buchanan. [22] Ingraham was described as no stranger to the generation of controversy by Variety,[26] and as a named provocateur by Politico. [27] Business Insider referred to Ingraham's on-air style as wad[ing] in debates on racism and gun violence. [28] In June 2019, Ingraham mocked reports that Trump delayed his participation in D-Day commemorative activities to sit for an interview with her and strongly dismiss them as patently false-fake news, despite video of the interview showing Trump. [29] Homosexuality In her senior year at Dartmouth College, during her tenure as editor-in-chief of the independent campus newspaper The Dartmouth Review,[30] Review,[30] various controversial articles. She sent a reporter undercover in 1984 to a campus Gay Student Association meeting, and later received criticism when she read, despite an oath of confidentiality to participants.[31] Ingraham published a transcript of the meeting and included the names of the participants, who described them as cheerleaders for laten campus edomities. [31] Ingraham claims confidentiality did not apply because the meeting was advertised and defended the exhib of the gay students as a freedom of the press issue. [31] Jeffrey Hart, the faculty advisor for The Dartmouth Review, described Ingraham as the most extreme anti-homosexual views imaginable, claiming she had gone so far to avoid a local meal where she feared the waiters were gay. [33] In 1997, Ingraham wrote an essay in The Washington Post in which she said she had changed her views on homosexuality after seeing the dignity, faithfulness and courage with which her gay brother, Curtis, and his partner were diagnosed with the latter. Curtis' partner eventually died of the disease. Curtis, on the other hand, called his sister a monster and said she was influenced by her father, which he described as a Nazi sympathizer as well as an abusive alcoholic. Ingraham said she supports civil unions between same-sex partners, but believes marriage is between a man and a woman. [36] Immigration and diversity Ingraham hold anti-immigration views. [37] In 2014, his House Majority Leader Eric Cantor condemned after expressing support for the DROOM Act and a GOP bill to grant a path to citizenship for young immigrants. [39] At the time, Cantor faced a primary challenge from Dave Brat, which he would continue to lose. [41] According to The New York Times, Few people have more than Ms. from uncertainty to national conservative hero. [41] Ingraham said the race would go down as one of the most important repudiations of the establishment of immigration reform I've seen in my 20 years of politics.[42] and that because of the outcome of the race, immigration reform is DOA. [43] Ingraham criticised Republican congresswoman Renee Elmers hard in the same year for expressing support for a comprehensive immigration bill that included a path to citizenship for the 11 million undocumented immigrants who were in the country at the time. In an interview with Elmers, Ingraham accused Elmers of supporting amnesty and using liberal talking points, saying her arguments were infallible to my listeners. [45] In September 2017, amid reports that Trump considered a deal with the Democrats on amnesty for about 800,000 DREAMers, Ingraham said criticized and tweeted When doing American working class w/from actual wage increase in 15yrs & what their children are after public schools get amnesty? In 2018, Ingraham criticised Republican congressman Kevin Yoder hard after expressing support for a Democratic bill that scrutinised Attorney General Jeff Sessions' order that immigration judges are not allowed to grant asylum seekers who are domestic abuse or gang violence in their home country. She called on the congressman to stop selling out the Trump agenda. On June 18, 2018, broadcast from The Ingraham Angle, Ingraham compared detention facilities where children from their illegal immigrant parents were separated by the Trump administration to summer camps that receive boarding schools. [49] She further described criticism of the family separation policy as faux liberal outrage. [51] Ingraham referred to the border crossings as a slow invasion of the United States. [52] Ingraham's comments followed an MSNBC report by Jacob Soboroff that was broadcast on 14 June 2018. The report describes a Texas detention facility set up to be like a food-salved structure with a cafeteria and rooms containing four beds in each one. [54] The day after Ingraham's comments, the school shot survivor and activist David Hogg attempted to renew boycotts of businesses advertising at The Ingraham Angle, but the show no longer lost advertisers. [55] Ingraham objects to the changing racial demography of the United States. [58] In August 2018, in what The Washington Post labeled as an expression of white anxiety,[60] she said, some parts of the country seem to be the America we know and love no longer exists. Massive demographic changes were foiled on the American people. And they are changes that none of us ever voted, and most of us don't like it... much of this relates to both illegal and, in some cases, legal immigration that is naturally progressive love. [61] Several commentators criticised Ingraham's comments, with The Atlantic claiming she was referring to the USA that became less and less white with every passing year. [63] Many outlets argued that it echoed white nationalist rhetoric or that he himself compiled a white nationalist rant. [64] [64] [65] Ingraham's comments were endorsed by David Duke. [68] [68] In gram, Duke has a racist freak whose name I don't even mention. [70] Some mainstream media described Ingraham's views as the advocate of the white genocide conspiracy theory. [72] In her August 9, 2018 Ingraham Angle monooog, Ingraham said she was not talking about race or ethnicity and continued to say, There is something that slips into this country and it is not about race or ethnicity and has continued to say, There is something that slips into this country and it is not about race or ethnicity. Not. This is what was once a common understanding by both parties that American citizenship is a privilege, and one that at least requires respect for the rule of law and loyalty to us In October 2018, Ingraham urged her audience to vote Republicans in the upcoming midterm election, saying that the Democrats want to replace you, the American voters, with newly ambited citizens and an increasing number of chain migrants. Ingraham showed a graphic on her show of prominent voices censored on social media in May 2019, which included people believing in border enforcement, people who believe in national sovereignty. Among those listed was Paul Nehlen, known for making numerous anti-Semitic remarks, which were banned from Twitter after making racist remarks about Meghan Markle, the wife of Prince Harry. [75] Ingraham claimed in September 2014 that President Obama sent Ebola outbreak to Africa during the 2014 Ebola outbreak and exposed Americans to the virus because of his guilt over colonialism. In June 2019, she distributed unsubsidized allegations that asylum seekers might be carrying to the United States ebola. Ingraham was criticised in February 2018 for making dismissed remarks that NBA players LeBron James and Kevin Durant should not be believers on politics. Ingraham said, It is always unwise to seek political advice from someone who is paid \$100 million a year to tie a ball and that the basketball stars should be locked up and dribble. Her comments came the week after James' interview with the Carl champion of ESPN where James spoke about his personal life as well as politics, declaring that he felt statements made by the president were laughable and frightening. Ingraham characterized James' remarks as rarely intelligent and ungrammatical. [quote required] Ingraham issued the following statement on the matter, obtained by TheWrap: In 2003, I wrote a New York Times bestseller called 'Shut Up & Sing,' in which I criticized celebrities such as the Dixie Chicks & Barbra Streisand who liquidated then-President George W. Bush. I've used a variation of that title for over 15 years to respond to artists who sound on politics. I told Robert De Niro to 'Shut Up & Act,' Jimmy Kimmel to 'Shut Up & Make Us Laugh,' and just this week the San Antonio Spurs' Gregg Popovich to 'Locked & Coach.' If pro athletes and entertainers want to freelance as political pundits, then they shouldn't be surprised if they are called out for abusive politicians. There was no racial intention in my remarks – false, blasphemous charges of racism are a transparent attempt to immunise entertainment and sports elites of investigation and criticism. In addition, we said on my show that these comments came from an ESPN podcast, which was not the case – the content was unaffiliated with ESPN. [88] [28] [81] In 2020, when Drew Brees (a white athlete) made his own political comments, criticised for reversing course and supporting his right to free speech, something she does not case with African-American athletes. [82] Stoneman Douglas shooting comments In March 2018, Ingraham's show was boycotted by 27 sponsors[83] after she mocked David Hogg, a 17-year-old student survivor of the Stoneman Douglas High School, for suspected rejected by four colleges. [84] In response, Hogg placed a list of Ingraham's advertisers and asked for a boycott.[85] accusing her of cyberbullying. [85] After several advertisers left the show[86][87] Ingraham apologised [89] which Hogg considered insincere. [90] Advertising time during the show declined by as much as 52 percent. [92] After Ingraham returned from a holiday to the boycott, her programme even earned its best ratings, with 25% in total viewers and saw an increase of 36% in the key 25-54 age group demographic. [94] From October 2018, blue-chip companies continued to shun Ingraham's show despite the increased ratings. [95] China condemned China's brutal violation of basic human rights and China's Xinjiang re-education camps for Muslim ethnic minority groups in August 2019. [96] Israel Ingraham is a supporter of Israel, who she called one of our neighbor alliance. She criticized Ilhan Omar's comments about Israel. [97] The coronavirus pandemic During the coronavirus pandemic 2020, Ingraham repeatedly pushed for the unproven drug hydroxychloroquine as treatment for coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). She characterized it as a miracle and discussed guests on her show to trump the drug. She mocked Centers for Disease Control and Prevention director Robert R. Redfield after warning against the drug. [98] After a study was released that tested the drug on 368 Veterans Affairs patients and showed that the drug was associated with an increased risk of death, she attacked the study as shocking and agenda-driven. [98] She questioned whether efforts to reflect effectiveness of the drug were caused by pure hatred from Trump? From Fox? From me? [98] On 15 June 2020, the Food and Drug Administration withdrew the emergency approval of hydroxychloroquine (and chloroquine). FDA said a review of some studies showed that the drugs' potential benefits in treating COVID-19 did not overwhelm the risks. Indian critics has criticised Ingraham's requirements for carrying facial masks publicly as a way to stop the spread of the coronavirus. [100] She took airtime to Harmeet Dhillon, a Republican operative who filed lawsuits against California to halt the implementation of residence home orders intended to halt the spread of the corona virus. She praised her as the charge of keeping Gavin Newsom's power grabs in check. In Ingraham and her guest Victor Davis Hanson dissected misinformed information about New Zealand's response to the pandemic on her show.
