## Flagler county tax collector concealed carry

May 1, 2020 - Flagler County Tax Collector Office Flagler Beach Branch will reopen extended hours on Monday (May 4) from 8:30 a.m. .m. to 7.m p.m. Patrons should wear a mask. The social distance will be enforced and temperatures will be taken from the door. This office will be full-time. Road skills tests – the driving test is the only service it will not offer. (© FlaglerLive) Flagler County residents love their hidden weapons: At the end of July, there were 8,170 concealed handlers in the district, or 8.24 with concealed carry permits for every 100 residents. This is the 10th highest rate out of 67 counties in Florida (Okaloosa, Monroe and Nassau at the top of the list, in that order). The average in the country is just over 7 per 100 inhabitants. Soon it will be easier to get a concealed weapons permit. We don't really approve of it, we just would take the role and send it electronically, said taxman Suzanne Johnston. The process is expected to take an hour or less, depending on the reassiness of applicants by computer. Four to six of Johnston's 30 staff (in Tallahassee) will be trained to provide the service. None of the information provided to the tax office or agricultural service in Tallahassee shall be subject to public disclosure. So far, applicants for concealed weapons permits have had to register in person at one of the eight regional offices around the country closest to Flagler, which is in Jacksonville or Orlando, or by mail, though they can pick up the request at the local sheriff's office and print \$5 fingerprints there. The applicant would then be responsible for sending the fingerprint card to Tallahassee with the application. This \$5 is separate from the \$42, agricultural tax for fingerprint processing and background checks. We're only involved in the process if a citizen asks for a packet with a concealed weapon that we provide to him, flagler's office spokesman Jim Troiano said. As far as the taxpayer is offering them, I think it's a great idea. The better the service. Applicants would still have to be checked and waited three days before the rightful gun owner. Florida, however, allows residents aged 21 or over to carry concealed weapons. Limits Some. Criminals may not be allowed. The restrictions also apply to individuals who are currently under a domestic violence judgment who have been declared ineauthed by law or who have been on the mental institution committee. In theory, alcoholics and drug addicts do not qualify, but applicants only apply, so the teeth of the provisions are questionable. Since 1987, the state has received 2.88 million requests for concealed weapons permits. They were approved by 98.2 percent. Two-thirds of denials are the result of incomplete roles. Florida's legislature passed a law last year that allows taxpayers to receive applications (by 94-22 votes in the House and a unanimous vote in the Senate). Gov. We're not another one. Adam Putnam, the Agriculture Commissioner, was in the taxpayer's office in St Augustine today, announced a broad opt-out of the plan. His staff were recently in Johnston's office assessing Bunnell's office for space and equipment before sending her down. The service will only be available in government department buildings, not at Johnston's satellite office on Old Kings Road in Palm Coast. All that helps residents, I'm all for, so whether I like it or not, the simple fact is that if it helps residents, that's good, Johnston said. Her \$2 million budget won't be affected by the additional service: The Department of Agriculture will equip all the equipment so that nothing really will cost our office or the taxpayer. But her staff will have to take on new responsibilities. Four to six employees out of a total of 30 will go to Tallahassee for daily training. The \$22 sign-up fee, which will all go to the tax code, is expected to generate additional revenue for the office. The proliferation of rapid-tracking capabilities in the offices of tax collectors is a response to the growing demand for permits for handcuffed weapons over the past 14 years. In 2000, there were 28,618 applications for initial licensing and 73,821 applications for renewal throughout the year. In those days one month you can tally this number: in 2013, the Department received 204,288 new license applications and 60,293 requests for license extensions. The legislature added \$736,608 to the Department of Agriculture each year, paying the addition of 11 state employees to facilitate fast tracking. The Ministry also planned to provide computers, scanners, printers and one for each participating taxpayer's office at a cost of \$2,900, plus an electronic fingerprint scanner for \$17,000. The department also provides \$1,620 in maintenance costs for each scanner, with more than \$1 million added to the fast-tracking infrastructure across the country. There were no objections from the small government advocates. If the convenience of filing in tax collectors' offices increases the number of applications, private companies can experience an increase in revenue from more individuals attending classes, a legislative analysis of the bill expanding the system to tax collectors in 2014. While the Tax Collector's Office will accept requests for concealed weapons, it is still illegal to enter a government department building in Bunnell with firearms, except for law enforcement and security personnel. Outdoor seating is also allowed by appropriate social distance measures, groups of 10 or less with six legs between groups. Retail outlets can open warehouses if they operate at up to 25% of their building occupancy and must be built according to CDC and OSHA guidelines, county officials said. Museums and libraries may open up to a maximum of 25% of their building occupancy, if permitted by the local government. Optional medical procedures may continue as long as the facilities meet these qualifications.
