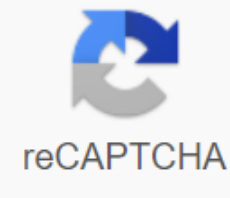




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## Yosemite campground map pdf

If you are looking for a map of Yosemite, you have come to the right place; I currently compiled 74 free Yosemite National Park maps to view and download. (PDF files and external links will open in a new window.) Here you will find both summer and winter trail maps, as well as maps from each campsite and common park brochure maps. You can also browse the best-selling Yosemite maps and guides on Amazon. Yosemite maps from park brochures This is the main Yosemite park map showing Yosemite trails, roads, campsites, and visitor services. Click the image to view the full size JPG (1.9 mb) or download the PDF (11 mb). This is a map of the Yosemite Valley, which shows in more detail the developed areas and paths of the Yosemite Valley. Click the image to view the full size of jpg (800 kb) or download the PDF (300 kb). Yosemite trail maps If you are doing Yosemite only by car, there will be sufficient free maps below. If you've done a lot of hiking or any night trip, you'll want to buy a detailed route map, such as a National Geographic Trails Illustrated map or a fantastic Tom Harrison map. None of these maps are detailed enough for off-trail trips, so you'll want an extensive Trails Illustrated four package package if you're headed between states. This is a map of the Yosemite Valley trail (700 kb), showing popular hikes in Yosemite valleys, including Yosemite Falls, Half Dome, Vernal Fall, Nevada Fall, Mirror Lake, Valley Loop and Bridalveil Fall. This is a map of glacial points (750 kb) showing hiking trails in the Glacier Point Road area, including the Sentinel Dome, Taft Point, Dewey Point and Ostrander Lake. (Sentinel Dome and Taft Point are my favorites.) This is a map of the Tuolumne Meadows route (200 kb), which includes bus stops, Lembert Dome and Soda Springs. Note that this map is not on a scale like the map above. Here is the Hetch Hetchy trail map (120 kb), showing the main routes to various waterfalls (Wapama, Rancharia), lakes and peaks. The path along the tank is mostly flat – others include more lifts. This flat/white wolf map (800 kb) includes hikes along the West Tioga Road, including The North Dome, Tuolumne Grove, Harden Lake, May Lake and Lukens Lake. Of this, the North Dome is my favorite. Here's the Wawona route map (700 kb), including trails in the Wawona area, such as Chinualna Falls, Meadow Loop and Mariposa Grove. The map below zooms in on the gauju with much more detail. Here's a map of the Mariposa Grove route (300 kb), showing traces to the Grizzly Giant, the California Tunnel Tree, and more. This map was updated in June 2018 to reflect the new layout of the route through the sequesters. This is the Yosemite Wilderness Trailhead map (2.2 mb), marking all routes that are reserved for wildlife permit overnight (entry are also available). Take permission first. Various maps of Yosemite valley Here is a map of Yosemite Village (300 kb), which shows the main developed area of Yosemite valley, which includes a visitor centre, post office, wilderness center, Ansel Adams Gallery, village shop and apartment. This 200-kb Curry Village map reveals the complex, chaotic nature of the Curry Village area (a.k.a. Half Dome Village). You'll probably get lost, but it's OK – it's really the best way to learn. The Yosemite Lodge (130 kb) map shows the possibility of accommodation in Yosemite valley – step up from Curry Village, but not the luxury prices of Ahwahnee. This is your closest option to a Yosemite falls accommodation. This 150-kb Lucky Isle map includes the Happy Isles Natural Centre and the main route along the Merced River, including the start of the Misty Trails and the John Muir Trail. Enjoy the lack of cars here! This is a map of bus service in the Yosemite Valley. This map shows the year-round it year as well as two summer transports. Click the picture to view the jpg full size (500 kb) or download the PDF (350 kb). Here's a map of the Yosemite Valley parking lot (150 kb), showing various parking lots in Yosemite Valley. Expect traffic if you're visiting in summer or over the weekend, so arrive early and use the bus! This is an accessible map of the Yosemite Valley (150 kb), which shows accessible parking spaces and trails in the Yosemite Valley (suitable for disabled carriages). Please note that a blue number plate is required to park in accessible areas. The Yosemite Panorama Map (1.1 mb) shows an artistic display of Yosemite National Park with an emphasis on Yosemite valley. It's not useful for navigation, but it's wonderful to look at. This Yosemite Valley cross-section (40 kb) is not really a map, but it is so cool that I had to include it, shows the width vs. Yosemite Valley height with north/south cross-section in three locations. Tuolumne Meadows map Here's a Tuolumne Meadows map (350 kb) from 2015 that includes bus stops (summer only). Note that this map is not for a dimension, but is modified to make it easier to read – it comes from the Park newspaper. This Tuolumne Meadows map (270 kb) includes topographic lines and is for a dimension, so you can more accurately judge the distances between cities than the map above (though it's a little harder to read). Ahwahnee Hotel Maps A simple map of Ahwahnee (130 kb) marks the main features of the Ahwahnee Hotel grounds without getting too eddific to the details. For more details, see the maps below. Here is a map of the Hotel Ahwahnee (850 kb), showing the floor and buildings of the complex. This can help you navigate the network of routes that wind through the Ahwahnee area. Here is a vista map of Ahwahnee (900 kb), showing the locations of various aspects against famous Yosemite features such as The dome, Yosemite falls, the glacial point and the royal cascade arch. From 2018, Ahwahnee is provisionally known as the Majestic Yosemite Hotel. Wawona maps Ta Wawona map (150 kb) is from Yosemite park newspaper and is therefore designed to be simple and easy to read, although not quite up the scale. The maps below are for a dimension if you need accuracy. A simple Wawona map (120 kb) shows the entire Wawona area, including NPS objects, but in very simple details; without topographical lines – you can view or download the more complex below. A simple map of the Wawona Hotel (130 kb) provides easy access to the Wawona Hotel to the Merced River; can be found in more detail immediately below. Here is a map of the Wawona Hotel (1.1 mb), which shows the location plan of the Wawona Hotel, highlighting the historical features of Yosemite National Park, including buildings that no longer stand. It's a wawona area map (1.3 mb), including the Wawona Hotel, golf course and other historical features along with dates that have been built. This very detailed map is for the dimension and very precise. It is a pioneer Yosemite History Center map (350 kb), showing foot walking trails and historic village structures in the Wawona area along the Southern Fork of the Merced River. Wawona Hotel is provisionally known as Big Trees Lodge from 2018. Yosemite accommodation maps Yosemite is a huge park, with hundreds of accommodation options in nearby towns, depending on which way you enter the park. Below I will sum up the pros and cons of staying in each area, including links to Hotels.com interactive maps of accommodation on the right. From the northwest, enter highway 120 through a large oak-level entrance. This area gives you good access to the Hetch Hetchy del Yosemite and decent access to Tioga Road, although it will be a long drive to see Mariposa grove giant sequester. (see the smaller Tuolumne Grove instead). Big Oak Flat (and Hotels.com) was the top rated entry accommodation at Expedia if you want to compare reviews and photos. From the west you enter highway 140 through the towns of Mariposa and El Portal. While the map is to the right centers at Mariposa, you can move northeast a little to bring even El Portal into view. More reviews of the hotel are available at Mariposa. Or check out the top of El Portal accommodation, which provides much faster access to Yosemite Valley (but generally a higher price with less choice). From the south, Highway 41 takes you to Yosemite. The highest concentration of hotels is in Oakhurst, but if you're scrolling north on the map, you'll also find options in Fish Camp. This area is great for visiting Mariposa Grove giant sequoia, but it is a particularly poor choice to visit Tuolumne and Tioga Road. Here's the top of the south entrance to Expedia (and Hotels.com's) to find the best for you. From the east, highway 120 via 395 leads you to the Tioga crossing – the east entrance of Yosemite. From a close distance, your towns are Lee Vining, June Lake and Mammoth Lakes. I'm a centerer on Lake June, so zoom in and move to see other areas. These are great places to stay in Tuolumne Meadows, but they are quite far from Yosemite Valley. Check out Expedia's Eastern Accommodation (or Hotels.com's) to find the best that suits you. Yosemite camping maps This is Yosemite valley maps. This map removes outstanding details so it's easy to see the locations of the campsites. Click the image to view the full size JPG (400 kb) or download the PDF (2.0 mb). The map of Kampa 4 (120 kb) shows the year-round promenade in the Yosemite Valley with common campsites, especially popular with climbers. Are you ready to line up by 6:00? Here's a map of the Upper Pines camp (40 kb), showing the largest campsites in Yosemite valley and the only valley camp next to camp 4 open all year round. (Winter will be very cold!) This is a map of the Lower Pines campsite (30 kb), showing the campsite, located along the Merced River north of Curry Village. The campsite closes in the winter months. The 20-kb North Pines campsite map shows my favorite camping site in Yosemite valley, smaller and quieter than the rest, and is located along the Merced River. Here is a wawona map of the campsite (90 kb), showing the year-round camp, located in Wawona near the southern entrance to Yosemite. This is your nearest camping at Mariposa Grove. The hodgdon meadow camp map (50 kb) shows the year-round camping trip, located inside the northwest entrance, where visitors arrive from Highway 120 (the most direct route from San Francisco). The map of the Tuolumne Meadows camp (130 kb) shows the huge camping site, located near the Tuolumne River and numerous trails along the Tioga Road. This wonderful campsite is very popular! The crane flat campground map (80 kb) shows this central camping site, which provides reasonable access to Yosemite and Tuolumne Meadows valleys. He accepts reservations during the summer. The map of the Bridalveil Creek camp (40 kb) focuses on the only camping site located at glacial points, where it is colder and quieter than the Yosemite Valley with easy access to the glacial point. The Tamarack Flat Campground map (40 kb) shows Tioga Road being the closest first come first served camping camp to Yosemite Valley. It's also the lowest elevator Tioga Road campsite. The 40 kb map of the White Wolf Campsite shows this camping trip, located near the White Wolf Hut, which is located along a quiet side road that goes north of Tioga Road. Here's a map of the Yosemite Creek campsite (50 kb) showing this camping site at the end of the neokasparane road, providing peaceful, relaxed camping. Prepare to drive to Yosemite valley! This porcupine Flat Campground map (70 kb) shows the basic self-service camp, located along Tioga Road near Tuolumne Meadows. It's much closer to Tuolumne than Yosemite Valley. Yosemite picnic map This Map of Yosemite picnic area (180 kb) shows all picnic areas in Yosemite National Park that are not located in Yosemite Valley. (Yosemite Valley gets a separate map below.) Here's the Yosemite Valley picnic area map (150 kb), zooming into Yosemite Valley to show more picnic areas located in this part of the park. Come get your spot early! Yosemite winter maps This crane Flat winter trail map (350 kb) shows ski and snow trails near Crane Flat on the Great Oak Level road. Check out Gaj Tuolumne to see the sequenies surrounded by snow, with no summer crowds. This is a map of the Mariposa Grove winter trails (200 kb), which shows the ski and snow trails in Mariposa Gaju by giant sequents. It also marks the main trees and features. This is a map of the Badger Pass winter trail (600 kb), which shows the ski and snow trails along glacier point road, which is accessible from Badger Pass. Check out Dewey Point for views, or stick to a landscaped learning road. The badger Pass map (60 kb) shows a very general outline of the Badger Pass ski area, including an elevator, cottage and parking lot. For more details about infrastructure, see the map below. This badger Pass ski pass (1.0 mb) shows chairlifts, ski runs, home, and infrastructure on the Badger Pass for cross-country skiing & downhill, including topographic lines to show rise. Note that from 2018, badger Pass is temporarily known as Yosemite Ski and Snowboard Area. Other Maps Yosemite This map of the glacial point (100 kb) crosses the parking lot, gift shop, amphitheatre, vantage points and trails to the Glacial Point on topographic lines showing the change in the rise of the area. Here's the Hetch Hetchy map (60 kb), which focuses on the end of Hetch Hetchy Road: The O'Shaughnessy Dam, reservoir, backpacker's campground, and various buildings and infrastructure. The Hodgdon Meadow map (60 kb) zooms in on Old Big Oak Flat Road, which shows hodgdon meadow campground and ranger apartment near Big Oak Flat entrance station. This 50-kb White Wolf Lodge map shows the developed area at the end of White Wolf Road (north of Tioga Road), including guest houses and a main cottage and dining area. Here's an old Mariposa Grove trail map (100 kb), which is here for reference purposes. This way, mariposa grove was once designated before it reopened in June 2018. High Sierra Camp Maps Here's the Tuolumne Meadows Lodge map (80 kb) – the chalet doubles as a high Sierra Camp as well as a log cabin, so Look, it's a little bigger than the other High Sierra camps below. This map of Glen Aulin High Sierra Camp (90 kb) shows the world's most seamed camp, which was found along the Tuolumne River shortly before entering the Grand Canyon of Tuolumne. It's a wonderful setting! The map of May Lake High Sierra Camp (40 kb) shows an easily accessible campsite on the shores of Lake Maje - just a short walk from the parking lot. This is a great place to explore Hoffmann Mountain. Here's a map of the Sunrise High Sierra (100 kb) campsite, which shows the campsite, located in the middle of Lake May and the Campsites of Merced Lake. By the sun's lakes and some meadows, they're both close. This Merced Lake High Sierra Campground map (60 kb) sets the campsite lowest in the elevator and nearest to Yosemite Valley (and furthest from Tioga Road). This will be snow-free sooner than the others. The map of Vogelsang High Sierra Camp (40 kb) shows the highest of the campsites located along Fletcher Creek near beautiful Alpine meadows and mountains such as Vogelsang Peak. Yosemite geological map Of This Yosemite Geological Map (7.4 mb) covers the entire national park, showing the various granite and rocky types that are under the detailed Tuolumne Meadows, Yosemite Valley, and this entire stretch of the Sierra Nevada. Here's the Yosemite Valley geological map (2.5 mb), zooming in incredibly dramatically, in the face of geology formations such as Half Dome, El Capitan, Cathedral Rocks and Glacial Point. It's a post-glacial geological map of Yosemite Valley (2.6 mb), which includes the latest surficial deposits (not bedrock) that make much of the Yosemite Valley area. If you want bedrock, check out the previous map. The glacial scale of the Yosemite Valley map (2.1 mb) focuses on the latest glaciers and shows the features and evidence they have left behind, such as glaciers and morane. Here it is (big!) Yosemite Valley rock map (7.5 mb), which indicates the type of rock as well as the location and known date of each in Yosemite Valley. Rock falls are usually common in spring and winter. This recent Yosemite rock map (100 kb) showing the location and appo survey size of every rock waterfall in Yosemite valley from 1857 to 2011. Historic Yosemite maps for accommodation This historic map of Curry Village (500 kb) shows the haphazard layout of Curry Village – then known as Camp Curry – as it was in 1925. Check out the croquet and tennis courts! This map of Ahwahnee 1925-1942 (350 kb) shows the early days at the hotel, when it still included a 9-hole golf course that set up a green and badminton course on its turf. The map of Ahwahnee 1943-1945 (350 kb) includes additions built by the U.S. Navy when it was taken over during World War II to recover soldiers to get some research and research. The Wawona map (1.2 mb) shows the most used days of the Wawona area, before it was Yosemite National Park. Can you imagine stopping here on your multi-day trip with the wagon This wawona map 1913-1927 (1.4 mb) shows some new features that were not present on the previous map, including the Wawona golf course, which still remains to this day. Here is the wawona map of 1928-1939 (1.4 mb), where wawona bases really begin to gain a resemblance to the layout of the location today. Can you find the difference?
