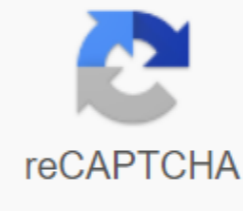

From the 1930s to the early 1960s, mail volume, particularly commercial mail, grew significantly, and the need for a better system became apparent. On July 1, 1963, the USPS introduced the zip code system (Zone Improvement Plan). In 1967, postcodes became mandatory in all post office. A zip code is a five-digit number that represents a specific location in the United States. The extended ZIP + 4 code adds a hyphen and four additional digits for an even more accurate location. Here's how it works: Announcement The first digit represents the status. Numbers increase as you move west. Several states share each digit—2, for example, represents the District of Columbia, Maryland, North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, and West Virginia.The second and third digits represent regions within the state—the first three digits create the Center Facility (SCF) sectional code. SMFs are the regional headquarters for mail classification and distribution. The fourth and fifth digits represent more specific areas, such as post offices and postal delivery areas within a city or city. ZIP + 4 has four additional digits that identify a specific segment of the five-digit delivery area, such as a city block, office building, or individual high-volume mail receiver. Postal codes and zip codes are numeric codes that are used to facilitate mail delivery, and area codes are used to specify a geographic region when calling a phone number. Instead of going through a large and unmanageable phone book, you can find and verify zip codes and area codes on the web quite easily. If you have a partial address or address, you can find the zip code through USPS Zip Code Lookup, a tool on the U.S. Postal Service website. You can also search by city or state, or find all cities that are part of a particular zip code. The International Zip Codes site, maintained by Columbia University, has an extensive index of national and international zip codes, as well as mail acronyms, policies and best practices. You can also use multiple search engines to find zip codes. With Google, for example, to do a zip code search by address, type what you know about the address to see a map of the location with the included zip code. You can even type something like the South Laurel MD zip code to see all of them for that area (and to find links that show a complete list of zip codes for that region). You can also enter a zip code to the geographic location to which it belongs, as well as a map and other related web results, such as cities that use that zip code. If you don't add zip code at the end of your search, Google may display unrelated information. For example, a 90210 search reveals information about the TV series, while zip code 90210 displays information about the zip code. You can also find a zip code with DuckDuckGo. Enter a zip code and DuckDuckGo returns a map, the location of the zip code, postcard, real estate, and other relevant web results. A zip code search in Bing brings back to the city or location to which it belongs, local maps and attractions, such as supermarkets, hotels and movie theaters. If you enter a partial address, Bing automatically completes it and reveals the zip code. As with a zip code, you can use a search engine to find an area code by searching for the city. To do the opposite and find out which part of the country an area code is related to, simply enter the area code in the search engine. To find an area code with Google, enter the name of the city and state you're looking for, followed by the word area code. You'll usually find what you need. For international announcements, look for a phrase like Kenya's calling code and you'll receive an informative response with the numbers you'll need to make a call to that nation. Enter your city and status in a new Bing search, and you're more than likely to see Google-like results that show you the area code at the top of the results. The same goes for international call codes. Another way to find an area code online is with Wolfram Alpha, which bills itself as Computational Intelligence. This data-driven search engine does not display results like the others mentioned on this page, but with a little digging, you can find unique information about cities and states that you may not find in another search engine. Using Yahoo to find an area code is very similar to using Google; just enter the city and state name followed by the area code, and you will get an instant result. Finding international codes isn't as easy with Yahoo as it is with Google, but of course, you can still use Yahoo to find other websites that can give you that information. Some sites specialize in finding area codes that a simple search engine query might not reveal. You can use these free resources to find almost any area code and/or country calling code in the world: Area Codes: Accounts area codes from most of the United States, although other countries are scattered around here as well. BT Phonebook: Use this site to find area codes in UK country codes: This site asks you which country you are calling from and where to assign the correct country code, area code or both. LincMad: A zip code map that provides a visual representation of area codes in the United States and Canada.AllAreaCodes.com: Similar to LincMad, you get a full area code map of U.S. and Canada, but also links to region-specific area code lists, details about area codes (e.g. mobile or landline, carrier, when introduced), search tools, and printable area code lists. Non-compulsory zip codes were introduced in the United States in 1963. Robert Moon, a postal inspector with the United States Postal Service, proposed the postcode system as of 1944. The U.S. Postal Service began using double-digit area codes 1943 in order to define postal areas in larger cities. From 1967, the zip code became progressively mandatory. The word ZIP comes from the acronym For Zone Improvement Plan. The original zip code consisted of 5 digits. In 1983, zip + 4 was introduced in order to make delivery to densely populated areas more efficient. Area code 960 is located in Maldives country.
