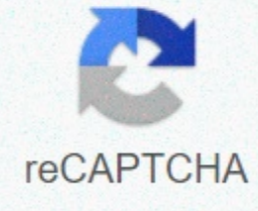

The series is a spinoff by Jessie and for the first three seasons includes stars Peyton List, Karan Brar and Skai Jackson, as well as Miranda May, who starred throughout the series. In February 2020, the series was renewed for its fifth season. [2] The Emma, Ravi and Zuri plot leaves New York and goes to Moose Rump, Tomorrow, to spend the summer at Camp Kikiwaka, where their parents met as teenagers. The Ross children and their new friends are trying to adapt to their life in the camp, which was founded by Jedediah Swearingen and is after a legendary, bigfoot-like creature that lives in the nearby forest. The camp has a notorious reputation for staying open, despite the violation of various health and safety codes In We Didn't Start the Fire, several cabins are destroyed by a fire after a candle is left unattended. In We Can't Bear It, the Ross kids return with a new generation of caravans to find the cabins were never rebuilt and Gladys ran off with the insurance money. These kids include the girl from the Destiny pageant, the cautious boy Mateo, and Lou Finn's dirty second cousin. The Ross children then convince their parents to buy Camp Kikiwaka and put them in charge. Finally, Emma, Ravi and Yuri agree to sell the camp to Lou while they go to pursue their dream jobs. Lou da Boss! Lou's in charge of Camp Kikiwaka now. While Lou wins Ava and Noah as fellow advisors, Destiny, Mateo and Finn win Gwen as a camper. Peyton List as Emma Ross[3] (regular series: seasons 1-3, guest: season 5[4]), the oldest of Ross's children and a training counselor in Cabin Woodchuck. She is proven to have a unique sense of fashion. She becomes camp manager in the third season. By the end of her third season, she becomes a supermodel in Milan for her mother's clothing line. Karan Bmar as Ravi Ross[3] (seasons 1-3), an extremely intelligent adviser in training in Cabin Grizzly. The second youngest of Ross's children, he brings his Asian water monitor pets to the camp. In the third season, he becomes camp chef and male senior advisor. By the end of the third season, Ravi is accepted into a scientific scholarship. Skai Jackson as Yuri Ross[3] (seasons 1-3), a sweet but sharp, sarcastic and talkative girl. She is the youngest of ross' children and is a caravan in Cabin Woodchuck. By the end of season three, Yuri had become an intern at her father's film studio. Miranda May as Lou Hochhauser.[5] a very enthusiastic farm girl and Emma's friend. She is the chief advisor to Cabin Woodchuck and is a longtime friend of Xander. In her fourth season, she becomes the principal director of Camp Kikiwaka. In Water Under the Dock, her full name is revealed to be Louella Dorecas Hockhauser. Kevin Quinn as Xander (seasons 1-2), cabin Grizzly's popular senior advisor and resident musician. He's a long time friend of Lou's and gets love for Emma. Nathan Arenas as Jorge (seasons 1-2), a boy with glasses of Hispanic descent, who is Ravi's friend and a camper in Cabin Grizzly. He's proven to be very dirty, unclean, and calls people weird. Jorge once claimed that he had been by aliens. Nina Lu as Tiffany (seasons 1-2), a young Champion of Chinese origin with whom Yuri befriends. She has an arrogant mother who expects much from her. Mallory James Mahoney as Destiny Baker[5] (season 3–present), a girl who has won almost all the beauty pageants she has competed in. She is also very competitive and wants to win at all costs. Raphael Alejandro as Matteo Silva[5] (season 3–present), a cautious boy who can find danger in any situation, wraps up sets of spider bites and snake bites, would prefer not to be at Camp Kikiwaka, and speaks Portuguese when he is either scared or emotional. Will Buie Jr. as Finn Sawyer[5] (season 3–present), Lou's second cousin and a dirty boy who doesn't care about hygiene, washing clothes or using the toothbrush. In By All Memes, his last name is revealed to be Sawyer. Shelby Simmons as Ava King[5] (season 4), a teenager from the big city and a new councillor who has never camped before. Scarlett Evastez as Gwen Flores[5] (season 4), a young woman who lived all her life and was previously educated at home by her parents. Israel Johnson as Noah Lambert[5] (season 4), a Los Angeles teenager and a new advisor who is an expert actor. Trevor Tordjman as Parker Preston (season 5)[6] Recurring Mary Scheer as Gladys (seasons 1-2), the strict owner of Camp Kikiwaka, descendant of Jedediah Swearingen. She's been jealous of Christina Ross since Christina stole her Morgan. Since then, Gladys has failed to get a boyfriend as most people she tries to romanticise in different ways. By the third season, gladys is reported to have left Moose Rump forever and taken the insurance money for the burned cabins, leaving the Ross children to earn ownership of the camp. Tessa Netting as Hazel (seasons 1-2; guest, season 4), chief advisor to the Kikiwaka camp and senior advisor to The Weasel Cottage, who was then relegated to CIT after accidentally burning Woodchuck and Grizzly Cottages. She is the granddaughter of Gladys (who share the same problem with men) and descendant of Jedediah Swearingen. He's trying to steal Xander's affection from Emma. By the end of her second season, Hazel is relegated to training after revealing her candle has burned down the cabins. In the Episode Inn Trouble, Hazel reappeared where she was looking for the time capsule that she and Lou buried when they were younger. Casey Campbell as Murphy, the camp chef who is responsible for terrible food and is gladys on and out of love interest. Although gruff and crude, Murphy also gets involved in many children's hijinks. All of its known cooking includes food from garbage, roadkill, and expired (possibly due to the camp budget being poor). In season three episode By All Memes, it was revealed that Murphy had resigned from work at Camp Camp and got a job as a chef at Camp Champion, rival camp, where his cooking is actually good. Nate Stone as Timmy, a tourist who was fired because his parents' check jumped and was never taken away by his parents. He is eager to enter the camp, but he never always succeeds, resulting in him getting lost in the woods and remaining forgotten, but in Up, Up and Away, he decides to give up and be adopted by Kikiwaka, the mythical monkey of the camp as the creature. Lincoln Melcher as Griff (season 2), a juvenile delinquent who is placed in grizzly cabin as part of his nature rehabilitation program in the juvenile hall during the second season. Eventually he decided to change his habits, and is now Xander's adoptive brother to avoid going back to correctional school. Lily Mae Silverstein as Lydia (seasons 2-3), a trailer in Weasel Cabin. Lydia is known for a very dark look, like black lipstick and a bandana, and her aggressive behavior similar to her her backs. The notable guest stars Cameron Boyce as Luke,[7][8] Emma's brother Ravi and Zuri, who was at summer school at the beginning of the series and occasionally visits them. Kevin Chamberlin as Bertram,[9] the Ross family butler. Christina Moore as Christina,[10] the mother of the Ross brothers and a graduate of Camp Kikiwaka. Raini Rodriguez as Barb,[11] the camp manager at Camp Champion, who is Lou's long-time rival. The cramped Champions episode reveals that her last name is Barca. Jerry Trainor as Dave,[12] Finn's mother's friend. Production Series is a spinoff by Jessie. [13] Bunk'd was renewed for the second season by the Disney Channel on February 29, 2016. [14] The second season premiered on August 23, 2016. The series was renewed for the third season of the Disney Channel on August 31, 2017. [15] On June 1, 2018, it was announced that Peyton List, Karan Bmar, Skai Jackson and Miranda May would return for the third season, and that Raphael Alejandro, Will Buie Jr., and Mallory Mahoney would join the cast. The third season premiered on the Disney Channel on June 18, 2018. In March 2018, actress Skai Jackson said in an interview that she was leaving Disney and that Bunk'd would end with her third season. [16] In September 2018, it was confirmed in a report by The Hollywood Reporter that Peyton List would leave the series even after the end of the third season. [17] On November 15, 2018, the Disney Channel announced that the series had been renewed for a fourth season. Miranda May, Mallory James Mahoney, Raphael Alejandro and Will Buie Jr. will return for the fourth season, and the new unannounced cast will star alongside them, while Peyton List, Karan Brar and Jackson won't be back on the show. In addition, Phil Baker and Erin Dunlap of Andi Mack were to take over as executive producers in the fourth season. Production for the fourth season began in March 2019. [18] On 18, 2019, it was announced that production in the fourth season has begun and that Israel Johnson, Shelby Simmons and Scarlett Evastez have been added to the series's distribution. On May 10, 2019, it was announced that the fourth season would premiere on June 20, 2019. [20] On February 24, 2020, the Disney Channel announced that the series had been renewed for a fifth season, with production due to begin in the fall of 2020. Executive producer Erin Dunlap will serve as the sole showrunner for the fifth season. In addition, all cast from the fourth season, with the exception of Scarlett Evastez, is set to return. [2] On August 26, 2020, it was announced that Trevor Tordjman of Zombies and Zombies 2 would join the main cast for his fifth season as Parker Preston. Production of the fifth season has not yet a definitive start date.
