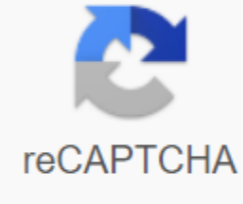




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Merck manual of medical information

The Merck Veterinary Manual, which was introduced in 1955, covers animal health care. Merck's Guide to Pet Health or pet owner, edition. Merck's Guide to Geriatrics was introduced in 1990, focusing on health care for older patients. Merck's Health and Ageing Guide is a consumer edition.
