D60 Students and Families: Pueblo School District 60 Go to School Plan (in Spanish) is a product of extensive planning and collaboration with the D60 community, involving a working group of stakeholders, including parents, leaders, teachers, students, support staff, as well as the Colorado Department of Education (CDE), the Colorado Department of Public Health and the Environment (CDPHE), and our local health partners in the Pueblo Department of Public Health and Environment (PDPHE). The first day of school for K-12 students was changed to Monday, August 31, 2020. This delayed launch ensures that our buildings are able to implement health and safety guidelines, develop technological devices and prepare teachers for a socially excluded, full teaching model in person or a mixed learning model. The D60 Go To School plan consists of several options for families: The first day of school for K-12 students will be Monday, August 31. K-5 Students: Complete personal learning four days a week, with health and safety measures in place, OR 100% on-line learning. 6-12 students: A hybrid model with two days of personal learning, and two days of distance learning each week, OR 100% online learning. Pre-K students will participate in a person four days a week (1/2 day or an all-day program). First day of preschool students will be Tuesday, Tuesday, 8. All K-12 students will be issued with a technology device. K-1 students will receive an iPad, 2-12 classes will receive a Chromebook. Class training as well as distance learning will include student technology devices. To request a 100% virtual instruction: To request one or more of your children to participate in a 100% online learning option, parents must complete an application for a full online learning form on the parents' portal. We ask that parents complete one application for one child that you want to participate fully online by Friday, August 7, 2020. If you don't have a parent portal or have trouble using it, call the parent helpline at 719-549-7111. Families that will not complete the survey will be automatically enrolled in the personal (K-5) or hybrid personal (6-12) model. log in to your district's primary portal and select the Survey tab, click the Request detailed instructions online link and click Start to answer five questions and click Complete Survey. Please note: All families are asked to commit to at least one semester of their training delivery model choice before allowing changes to another model. Half a year can be asked for changes in difficult situations. As students return to class, we will ensure the safety of our students and staff as much as possible. This is a priority for the whole community, and we all have to do our part to make this happen. Included in the D60 Go to School plan are the many health and safety protocols that D60 is taking to reduce the impact and spread of COVID-19. Masks must be worn by all students and adults. The D60 will provide one fabric mask for each student and district employee. All buildings will be subject to social disaggregation measures and hand washing expectations. Temperature checks and health checks will be carried out daily on arrival for all students and adults. We will reduce the interaction of groups of students using the cohort. We will create a cleaning mode that is frequent, purposeful and sufficient to reduce transmission. Parents and carers will have to check, monitor and self-report their child's health when problems arise. This return to school plan is designed to strike a balance between the health problems posed by COVID-19, quality education programming, and the needs of our community. The D60 will continue to focus on the guiding principles proposed in our strategic plan, including our core value, that the social and emotional well-being of our students is as important as their academic needs. We will continue to be ready to adapt and adapt training presentations as local Pueblo County health or D60 specific health context changes. Our plan is to help schools plan how to start school year and will be updated as necessary in order to align with current health practices. D60 we understand that the 2020-21 school year is unlike any previous year in the history of our nation or district. We know that every family has a personal choice when it comes to educational opportunities for their children. We aim to adapt to the ever-changing conditions associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as to provide equal access to high-quality preK-12 education in a safe environment.
