Notary oath fees: \$10.00 Certified Documents (excludes vitals): \$5.00 front page, \$2.00 each additional page Document formatting requirements * Documents must be on an 8.5 x 11-inch white paper or an 8.5 x 14-inch white document. * Black ink should be used with a font size of at least 9 items. Blanks in the tool can be completed with a pen, and corrections can also be made by a pen. * At the top of the first page should be a 3-inch field. All other fields on the first page and all fields on the following pages must be at least 1/2 inch. * At the top of the first page, under a 3-inch field, specify the name of the tool (i.e. warranty lobby, drop claims, etc.) * The text should only be on one side of the page. * The person presenting the registration tool must report the amount of tax payment to the Register of Deal. [3] Granville County, North Carolina Record Dates[edit] The information for this chart was taken from a variety of sources, often containing contradictory dates. This information must be accepted as guidance and must be verified by contacting the county and/or government agency. On June 28, 1746, 1,746 Granville County were created from Edgecombe County. The place in Oxford County[5] granville county has been through many boundary changes over the years, as it was originally an unusually large area that spanned much of the northern stretch of Piedmont territory along the border with Virginia. As noted above, most counties in the area were once part of Granville, first when Orange was formed from parts of Granville, Blade and Johnston in 1752 and then in 1764, when Booth County was formed. Orange and Booth counties have spawned new their own constituencies over successful years, and the current Granville day covers only a small portion of their once huge holdings. Then in 1786 there was another small change of county lines. While Booth County was written off in 1779, when it was divided to form Franklin County from its sour half and Warren from the northern half, there was a further change a few years later. According to the Formation of NC Counties 1663-1943, David Leroy Corbitt, part of Grenville was annexed to Warren in 1786 Starting from the point where the dividing line between Warren and Granville counties would touch the dividing lines between that state and Virginia, and operate from there west on the specified line to Nutbush Creek; from there said the creek is meandering to the gyr of Anderson's swamp, from there to the Stark Mill, from there along a line that will run across the south until it touches the aforementioned dividing line between Warren and Granville, and the same will be joined and will remain part of Warren County... The same area later became part of Vance County in 1881, when that county was formed largely from Granville and parts of Warren County. formed in 1746 from Edgecombe County, in honor of Earl Granville, the owner of the soil. Since Edgecombe retired from Craven around 1733, Granville is therefore Craven's grandson. When it was first established in 1746 Granville embraced for five years, until 1751, all present warren, Franklin and Vance, most orange, including the present Man, Caswell, Orange, and Wake, Durham, Alamyns, part Guilford and possibly the whole of Rockingham, is a vast area from which one William Perisch was the first sherif. After 1751, Orange and Granville districts dominated this wide Virginia line until Wake and Chatham formed around 1770, with the apparent goal of a forest of troubled and embryonic element regulator who were furious over the escalating fees and burden charged by the thriving officeholders of two major domains. In 1764, Booth County was created from an area now covered by Warren and Franklin counties, and thus the size of Granville was again markedly reduced. From 1764 to 1851, a period of eighty-seven (87) years, Granville County included its present boundaries plus most of the present Vance Co. The district's first officers were Wm. Person, the 1st sheriff; Robert Foster, clerk; Robert Jones Jr., King's attorney; Wm. Eaton, William Persona, James Payne, Edw'd Jones, Edw'd Martin, John Wade, Lemuel Lanier, Gideon Macon, John Brantley, West Harris, Lemuel Henderson and Jonathan White, Justice of peace. According to North Carolina's oldest records, the area that became Granville was first inhabited around 1715, at which time most Native American Indians migrated to other places, leaving it ripe for new settlements. Among the first settlements in Granville were those along the northern border at Nutbush and Grassi Creek, and on the Tar River. The courthouse was located in what is now Warren County, seven miles above Gaston, on Rocky Creek, near Boiling Spring. Booth County was formed from Granville in 1764, which was, in 1779, divided into Warren and Franklin, and Booth's name was obliterated from north Carolina's list of counties. Granville was reduced in 1764 to its current size, the venue for its trial was lifted about two miles above the town of Henderson, at the edge of Mr Brodie Lane, on the road leading to Oxford, where one or two court terms were held when it was removed in Harrisburg, and after holding one trial, it was removed to Oxford around 1769.
