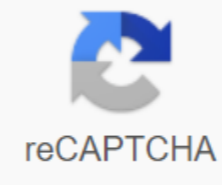

She co-wrote songs with Ed Sheeran, including Thinking Out Loud for which she won the 2016 Grammy Award for Song Song year. Early in life Wadge was born and raised in Backwell, a small village just outside Bristol, England. Her father's passion for music greatly influenced her, and about her paternal influences, she said she grew up listening to the first Elton John, Joni Mitchell and James Taylor. That's what I cut my teeth and now I'm listening to everything you can imagine from hip hop to country. She began writing her own songs at the age of 9 on the family piano. When she was 11, her parents bought her first guitar from a scrap shop. It was when Wadge herself learned to play along Tracy Chapman's debut album that she discovered her affinity for guitar. [citation needed] While still in school, Wadge regularly gigged around Bristol. At the age of 14, she signed her first recording contract with her band Two uv a Mind. She released her first single at the age of 16. [2] Songwriting Career In addition to writing songs for herself, Wadge has been active in collaborating with new performers in Britain, most not most Ed Sheeran. The two collaborated on a number of songs, and Sheeran titled her self-published 2010 EP Songs I Wrote with Amy. A track has been included with the deluxe edition of Sheeran's album. Wadge continued its collaborative relationship with Sheeran in 2014. The single Thinking Out Loud, written on a guitar given to Sheeran, appears on the album x.[4] Wadge also wrote with Lewis Watson, with tracks Halo and Sink or Swim appearing on the album The Morning (All of the Songs). She has collaborated with Shannon Saunders, Anna Pancaldi and other notable artists. She wrote and performed songs from the BBC Wales' Keeping Faith soundtrack in 2018, and for the second series, which will be shown in 2019. Wadge also co-wrote Consequences, the third single from Camila Cabello's debut album, Camila. Solo artist Having moved to Wales and graduated from the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama, Wadge began performing at open mic sessions in Cardiff's Toucan Club and quickly began to develop a fan base and gain critical recognition. She was quickly spotted and received encouragement from some of the city's great players, among them Manics/Catania/Super Furry Animals producer Greg Haver, who recorded his first mini-album, The Famous Hour. This album has earned him more attention and praise. She played alongside Stereophonics, Embrace and Lenny Kravitz at the BBC 6 Music launch party. In 2002, Wadge won Best Female Solo at the Welsh Music Awards, ahead of Charlotte Church. [6]. In 2003, she toured Australia with the Welsh rugby team during the Rugby World Cup with the song Adre Nól. Later that year, she retained her Best Female Solo Act at the Welsh Music Awards. 2004 saw his release his first full album, WOJ (a piece on his surname, which is often misspelled), at Acclaim. In June 2004, she performed at the Royal Albert Hall in London on a bill that included Jeff Beck and Jan Hammer, ranked by Billboard magazine as one of the most profitable concerts in the world of the summer. [7] 2006 saw the release of Wadge's second album, No Sudden Moves. The album includes a cover of Manic Street Preachers' single A Design for Life. 2008 saw the release of her third album, Bump, which (according to her own sleeve notes) was recorded over two days when she was 8 months pregnant. It includes a cover of Don't Leave Me This Way (originally recorded by Harold Melvin - the Blue Notes, and later covered by The Communards). On Monday, November 2, 2009, Wadge released his new single Hold Me with the new label, Choice Music. She also published a Welsh version of the track (Dal Fi) which was a fundraiser for daughter Ysgol Feithrin (Wales kindergarten), with 20p of the sale of each Welsh language download given to Mudiad Meithrin, a Welsh-language nursery organisation. In 2010 and 2011, Wadge and Pete Riley released a CD (Rivers Apart), as well as two live DVDs, and toured largely together. His single USA? We'll Wait and See was released in English and Welsh. She occasionally presents programmes on BBC Radio Wales. She presented Suck It and See, a harmonica show on BBC Radio 4. Wadge's personal life is married to actor Alun ap Iwan. They live near Pontypridd, Wales.
