## Unbroken google drive

Google Drive is a hugely popular cloud storage service that lets you save different files to the cloud and then access them from your smartphone, tablet, or computer. It's pre-installed on most new Android phones, and you already have an account if you've ever used Gmail. It's powerful and easy to use, but if you're new to cloud storage and never use competitors like Dropbox or Box, it can be a bit overwhelming. We won't get too technical here, but Google Drive is Google's cloud storage solution. It allows you to store media and documents on Google servers, so you can free up space on your hard drive and access them from almost any device with an Internet connection. Before we delve into all the features and show you how to use Google Drive, let's talk about some basic things you need to know. First, you need a Google Account to use the service. It is free and can be configured in minutes. Your account gives you access to all Google services like Drive, Gmail, Photos, YouTube, Play Store, and so on. You can access Drive on the web by drive.google.com or through the free Android app. You can also view all the files in the Drive folder on your Google Drive desktop computer, but you'll need to download the software first. Here you click on the coding settings in the upper right corner, and then download the drive to your desktop. Follow the installation instructions, then just run the program and go through the setup process, after which you will see the Google Drive icon on the Favorites tab in Windows.Google Drive pricesYou will get 15GB of storage, you will get 15GB for free, which is shared between Drive, Gmail and Photos. That's enough for most people, but you can add more for a monthly or annual subscription fee. This subscription is now called Google One and gives you additional benefits beyond more storage, such as discounts in the Google Store and additional users for families. We're just focusing on pricing in Google Drive, so let's look at raw storage. A 100GB plan will bring you back \$2 per month, 1TB costs \$10 per month, while 10TB \$100 per month. Fortunately, Google Drive supports file types including .jpeg, .png, .gif, mpeg4, .mov, and .avi — see the full list here. There are also file size limits, but they don't cause problems for most users:Documents: Up to 1.02 million characters. If you convert a text document to Google Docs format, it can be up to 50 MB. Spreadsheets: Up to two million cells for spreadsheets created or converted to Google Sheets. Presentations: up to 100 MB for presentations converted to Google Slides. All other files: up to 5 TB. That's all for our primer on what Google Drive is some basic things you should know before you start. Now that we have that out of the way, paradises take a look at how to use Google Drive. How to upload and download Google Drive files? To access files in Google Drive, you'll first need to upload them to a website, computer, or mobile client. First, we'll talk about an internet client where there are two ways to upload files to Drive. The first is a drag-and-drop method: select the file you want to upload from your computer, drag it to Drive in a browser window, and drop it. This works for both individual files and folders. The second option is to click the New button in the upper-left corner of the site and select File Upload or Upload Folder (picture above). Then select the files or folders you want to upload, click open or upload, and you're good to go. An even easier way to upload to a Google cloud server is to use Google Drive for Desktop. Just drag the documents you want to upload and drop them into your Drive folder. This basically works the same as transferring files from one folder to another on your computer, although it may take some time for the files to sync. Transferring files from your mobile device is just as easy. Open the Drive app, click the + icon in the lower-right corner, and select the file you want to send to the cloud. You can also quickly upload files by opening them by pressing the Share button and then save them to Drive. Downloading files from Google Drive is also quick and easy on any device with an Internet connection. If you're using Google Drive for desktop, you can copy everything you upload to any other folder on your computer, just like any other file. You can also download files from an online client by right-clicking and clicking Download. This works for both individual files and entire folders. On mobile devices, it's more convenient to leave your files in the cloud and just open them when you need them, but there are times when you need to find this download button in Google Drive. Everything you need to do Find the file in the app, tap the three dots on the right and then download and you're good to go. How do I organize and delete files in Google Drive? You can organize files in Drive in the same way you organize them as you would on a computer. You can leave them all in one place (My Drive) or different folders. To create a folder in the Web client, click New, and then choose Folder. You can also right-click in the Drive folder on your computer and create a new folder, as usual in Windows. On mobile devices, press the blue + button and select a folder, as shown in the screenshots below. To move files to a web folder, simply use the drag-and-drop method for the Web client and Drive folder. This also works on mobile devices, but in my experience, it's faster if you tap the More Actions (three vertical dots) icon next to a file, select Move, and then select a new file location. How do I delete disk files? Because storage is at a premium in the cloud, it's important to know how to delete Drive files to clear space. The easiest option on the web is to select a file or folder and press delete on your keyboard. This works for both the web client and the Drive folder. To remove a drive document from your mobile device, tap the More Actions icon next to the file (three vertical dots) and choose Delete. How do I share files in Google Drive? One of the best things about Drive is being able to share files with others. These can be individual documents as well as folders. To share a google drive file or folder, select it and click the Share Link icon, and then copy and share the link with the people you want. You can also click Sharing Settings, where you can turn on editing permissions and send a link directly to someone's email address. The process is similar for mobile devices. Tap the More Actions icon (three vertical dots) next to the file and turn on Link Sharing. The link will be copied automatically so you can go ahead and paste it into the messaging app and send it to a friend. You can also tap Add people to send a link to your email address. How do I use Google Drive in third-party apps? The drive is connected to a Google office suite that includes Google Docs, Sheets, and Slides that compete with each other in Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint. Although these three services have their own dedicated Web site, each document you create is automatically saved to Drive. The drive also supports other Google services, such as Google Forms, Google Drawings, and more. You can create a document directly from the Drive web interface or mobile app, which will then take you to a dedicated Google Doc website. Click the blue New button in the upper-left corner of your site, and then select Google Docs, Google Sheets, or Google Slides. On mobile devices, tap the blue + icon and choose from three options in the previous sentence. No matter which option you choose, you'll always have access to all the documents you've created from your COMPUTER, mobile device, and Drive folder on your computer. Google Drive also integrates with many third-party apps. Companies. include: DocHub (PDF signing), Pixlr Express (photo editor), Draw.io (diagrams), and more. One third-party app that works with Google Drive is WhatsApp, where you can actually store older messages in a cloud service. In even better messages, WhatsApp has made a change that allows people to store messages in Google Drive without counting them within storage limits. You can check the full list through the web interface: click New and select More, and then connect more apps. When you see something you like, click Connect to integrate it with Drive. Using Gmail's Drive integration One of the best and most useful integrations is between Gmail and Drive. In fact, unofficial support for using Gmail for storage precedes Google Drive as a service. Fans created a program called Gmail Drive that allowed gmail to be used as storage media. Of course, when you started Google Drive and Desktop Drive, Gmail was no longer needed and is no longer supported. You can then go to the file and share it. On mobile devices, click the Attach (paper clip) icon at the top of the screen, and then click Insert from Disk. It's also an easy way to share large files that are shared as links rather than attachments. You can also easily save Gmail files to disk. Just mouse over the image or other media file and click the Drive icon in the lower right corner. On mobile devices, you'll need to press the image for a long time, and then tap View Picture. Tap the More Options icon (three dots) in the upper-right corner, then save to Drive. It's worth noting that Gmail files count towards the same storage limit as drive files, so you don't really save space that way. However, you can make it easier to search the Drive interface on the web, mobile devices, and computers. How do I use Google Drive offline? Having files online is ideal for accessing them from multiple devices, but it can also mean you won't be able to see or edit them without an Internet connection. Fortunately, this doesn't apply to Google Drive. The service is offline, allowing you to access files when you are not connected to the Internet. You can view and edit files, including Google Docs, Sheets, and Slides, and all changes are synced automatically when you reconnect to the Internet. You need to enable offline access individually for each device. On your computer, open the settings menu and turn on (image above). Also, be sure to download the Google Dots extension offline in Chrome. When you're done, you can visit the Drive website to view or edit your files. Keep in mind, however, that you'll need to use Chrome for this to work. Of course, of course, also open the files through the Drive folder on your computer, which will then open in Chrome. Things are slightly different on mobile devices. You'll need to open the Drive app, tap the More Actions icon (three vertical dots) next to the file, and then select Offline Available. Alternatively, you can long press the file, then select additional and follow the same procedure to enable offline mode for multiple files at the same time.
